To be a lifeguard during the Keji Tri Adventure Camp 2023

Accountable to

Responsibilities:

Pre-Camp:

- To attend the Health Services pre-camp planning meetings face to face or via video conference call.

Camp:

- To attend staff meetings.
- To supervise all aquatic activities at Kedge beach which involve our campers.
- To ensure the waterfront equipment and management conforms to the Lifesaving Society Waterfront Guidelines or Municipal and/or Provincial/Territorial regulations, whichever is higher.
- To ensure the ERP is effective for the general safety of all waterfront activities.
- To advise the Responsible Guider of any changes in the Waterfront.

Post Camp:

- To assist with closing of the campsite
- To prepare a final Waterfront Report of the camp and forward it to the Health Services Lead
- To return all external resource equipment, supplies and resources to the Health Services Lead
- Submit an evaluation and report to the Health Services Lead

Qualifications:

- Hold a current National Lifeguard Service (NLS).
- A waterfront specialty is preferred.
- Current Standard First Aid and CPR.
- A knowledge and understanding of Safe Guide Procedures for Water Activities.

Term of Office

The term of office will be as outlined by the By-laws of Girl Guides of Canada. Be present for the duration of the camp including set up and break down. The time required for the work of the position varies considerably; approximately 5 - 10 hours per week, on average, will be required.
