

OVERVIEW FOR GUIDERS

This overview of Girls for Safer Communities (GFSC) will help you:

1. Understanding GFSC

The Girls for Safer Communities (GFSC) program activity aims to increase awareness about safety concerns of girls and women while mobilizing girls to become leaders in their communities.

Pathfinders and Rangers receive leadership and safety training through their Unit Guiders or at a GFSC workshop that prepares them to:

- Lead younger girls, their peers or other community members in conducting their own community safety audit
- Work with members of the community to make recommendations and create action plans that will improve safety for everyone

The skills girls develop through GFSC are transferable to other areas of their lives.

What is a community safety audit?

Safety audits are a tool for assessing how safe your neighbourhood is. Girls walk around the area using a checklist to assess safety features such as lighting, traffic and signage, to determine what action to take to improve safety. Through this audit, girls become more aware of factors affecting their personal safety while working together to make their community safer.

The audit is followed up by completing an audit report card that summarizes the safety audit findings that Members can submit to local officials to address the safety issues raised by the audit.



Formats for training Pathfinders and Rangers to lead a safety audit

Pathfinders and Rangers learn how to facilitate a safety audit by participating in leadership and safety audit trainings facilitated by their Guiders. The training can be conducted in one daylong workshop or be spread over several Unit meetings as one of the meeting activities. Please see the chart below for different ways the trainings can be broken down and delivered.

Flexible training options



Pathfinders and Rangers who complete the training are designated as Safety Audit Leaders who can lead others in conducting safety audits. Participating Units will go on to work within their community to make recommendations and create action plans that will improve safety for everyone.

GFSC training completion is an accomplishment that can be added to a Pathfinder's or Ranger's membership (iMIS) record. Submit a list of the trained Pathfinders and Rangers to your local membership (iMIS) input site or to your provincial office.

5. Guiders' roles in GFSC

There are three roles a Guider can play in GFSC:
