BC Trefoil Guild Education Grant - update

The Awards Committee awarded two (2) TG Education Grants to some very deserving Adult Guiders who are continuing with their post secondary education. For Guilds without an account, forward funds to your Area Treasurer and she will be able to electronically forward funds. In either case, please ensure that this General Ledger (G/L) account number is included with the donation. Both financial platforms have comment boxes to use to write down where the donation should go. Please include the following in the comment box – "02600-10-1003104 - EXTERNALLY RESTRICTED FUNDS - BC Trefoil Educational Grant."

Crests are available for online ordering by Girl Guides of Canada units (BC and non-BC) with payment made through the GGC unit banking system. Orders will be filled on a first come first served basis and you will be contacted if your order cannot be filled for any reason. Crests are available while supplies last and future availability (restocking) is not guaranteed. Please allow several weeks for order processing, payment, and shipping to your provided address. A flat shipping fee of \$5 will be charged and is automatically applied to orders, unless your order will weigh over 500 grams; if so, who ever orders will be contacted by email or phone to confirm a new shipping fee that reflects the postage cost of shipping a larger package.

One question I've been asked concerning Unified Banking, if Guilds don't go to UB, will they lose Membership Status? No, Guilds and Guilds Members, will not lose Membership Standing. You will all still remain Members of Girl Guides of Canada. You join UB for banking purposes only.

Guild Members have a wealth of knowledge, history of Guiding and mentorship that we can use to assist in ways we are comfortable doing.

Member Information Management

A reminder to Guild Leads, continue to check your Guild Rosters on Member zone. You should keep them up to date to show which Members are in your Guild and who is not. It's also important to check on who has a PRC coming due or sometimes overdue. Also, it's a good way to see who has a significant Membership Pin coming up for presentation. Work with your Area Awards Advisor to ensure we honour our long-time Guiders.

ORIGINS OF THE GIRL GUIDE COOKIE

Velma Tutte, a Minoru member, joined the Girl Guides in 1936. At that time the Girl Guide leaders handed out the cookie recipe and each Girl Guide had to make the cookies and bring them in to the club.



The Commissioner then packaged them in little brown bags to sell. Velma sold one of the first bags of Girl Guide cookies, although the first ones were much like the 'Dads' cookies. Who would know that 77 years later she would still be selling cookies?

In Memory ~ Georgia Runcie

We were notified that Georgie passed away April 14, 2022.

She was not in a Trefoil Guild, however was our Provincial Commissioner May/1979 to May/1984. She was also a Deputy PC from Sept/1973 to May/1979.

Her last Guiding role was with the BC Archive Committee. She was in her glory on that Committee; always wanting to show the Guiders and Youth Members all that BC had in their Archives and Museum collection. This was probably her longest held position, from Nov/2001 to Aug/2018.

Georgia was also a Brownie Guiders for numerous years; in her home town of Burnaby, BC.

Georgia joined Girl Guides of Canada in 1956, and was presented with her 70th Membership Pin, including 3 years as a Youth Member. She was an Honourary Life Member and was presented with the BC Award in 2009 for all the Guiding Service done for BC Guiding and its Members.

I received many messages letting me know that Guild Members remembered Georgia from our annual AGMs for BC Council. Also, many remember her from the Thinking Day Tea and Tours at the old Guide House. At both of those events I personally spent time chatting with Georgia. She was a wonderful Guiding Sister.

For those interested; Georgia Runcie's memorial service will be at:

Complete an adult training session either in person or online. 4. Do some research on International Guiding and Trefoil Guilds (or their equivalent) around the world. Then visit a Pathfinder or Ranger Unit and share what you learned. 5. Invite current and retired Guiders to visit (and potentially join) your Trefoil Guild. 6. Plan or help with a District or Area-wide event for other Trefoil Guild members. 7. Help with cookie selling at a Unit/District event. 8. Provide IM'ing at Provincial events, i.e., Pathfinder Summit or Ranger Revolution.

Connecting with Each Other (Complete a minimum of 4 activities) 1. Brainstorm within your group and make a list of activities that you want to do as a Trefoil Guild for the year. 2. Connect with another Trefoil Guild in your Area. Consider doing a joint activity. 3. Create a closed or secret Facebook group page for your Guild and use it to stay in touch, plan activities and share pictures. 4. Organize a breakfast party with your Guild – PJs, pancakes, cheesy movies. 5. Participate in a cookie exchange – everyone brings a dozen cookies, with the recipe, and you all leave with an assortment of different cookies and new recipes. 6. Together, try something new that you've always wanted to do but never had the time— go karting, laser tag, rock climbing, kayaking ... the possibilities are endless. 7. Write a blog post about your Trefoil Guild and submit it to GirlGuidesCANBlog. 8. Post a selfie in uniform on Facebook or Instagram, and use the caption to describe one of your favourite Trefoil Guild memories. 9. Find a creative way to display the things you have done in your Trefoil Guild and send this to bc-trefoil@girlguides.ca to be included in the BC Bulletin.

Back to Basics (Complete a minimum of 4 activities) 1. Go camping with some of your fellow Trefoil members.

- 2. Offer to share a passion (gardening, crafting, scrapbooking, etc.) with an age-appropriate unit.
- 3. Participate a service project that helps those in your community.
- 4. Participate in or plan a campfire or singalong event.
- 5. Do a park clean up or spend some time volunteering in a community garden.

Return to Guiding – Guidelines as of March 28, 2022.

Current Guidelines can be found on Memberzone.

BC is currently in Indoor 2 Stage.

Indoor stages ~ During Indoor stages (Indoor 1, Indoor 2 and Overnight 2) there is no restriction on the number of people who can cook.

Eating and drinking is permitted indoors, although eating outdoors is strongly preferred.

In Indoor 1 masks must be worn at all times, including when sitting at a table and in shared accommodations, unless people are actively engaged in eating.

When possible, groups that are sharing accommodations should also be seated together during meals and snacks.

When possible physical distancing of 2m should be maintained between all individuals, at all times, even when not required by government regulations.

Eating and drinking indoors should not be a social activity. Guiders must take steps to minimize the length of time the group is eating indoors.

Guiders should not be eating at a restaurant as an only Adult Guiding activity.

The Team of Prov. TG Liaisons, along with the National TG Liaison are working with the Risk Management Team at National in the hopes of having Adult Only Guidelines being adopted. Until then, we must follow the guidelines published.

In the future, if photos or reports lay out Guild activities going against the published Guidelines, I will not be putting them into our Bulletin. As well, they will be removed if posted on our FaceBook page.

I appreciate your understanding in this; we are one organization and must follow the procedures and policies as set out by the organization.

This year April 2022 some of us met at the Seymour Golf Course for a lovely lunch. We were so glad to see one another


and plan future

Our talented ladies excelled at decorating their hats for our parade:










