I continue to meet virtually with my Provincial Trefoil Guild Liaisons and our National TG Liaison Sharron Callahan.

BC Council Girl Guide Provincial Volunteer Opportunities

Each year, BC Council prepares for the conclusion of provincial council member and adviser terms (typically three years in duration), and the start of new adventures as new volunteers come forward. We have exciting opportunities coming up in spring 2023 (with start dates anticipated in May/June 2023 for most positions) as Guiders finish their terms and move on to new Guiding experiences. We invite applicants with diverse skills and perspectives to apply.

Now is your chance to join one of our exciting BC Committees, or to take on a BC Council role!

We're looking for people with passion, experience, and commitment from diverse communities, who want to help grow Guiding and be a catalyst for a better world, by girls.

All positions are open until filled. The next round of application reviews and selections will take place on or after January 30, 2023.

Upon request, GGC will make available reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities during the recruitment process.

If interested, I welcome all to apply. I have truly loved this position and will be here to support our new representative at BC Council.

BC Trefoil Guild Education Grant

Donations can be made by individual Guild Members or Guilds as a group. I do know the process to obtain an official tax receipt; and if you donate and require one, another reason to let me know.

Thank you to all Guilds who have donated to this Grant. We do receive wonderful thank you notes from Guiders who apply and are selected. I will share those notes soon....

For Guilds with a Unified Banking account, you can simply transfer funds to Area/Prov electronically. For Guilds without an account, forward funds to your Area Treasurer and she will be able to electronically forward funds. In either case, please ensure that this General Ledger (G/L) account number is included with the donation. Both financial platforms have comment boxes to use to write down where the donation should go. Please include the following in the comment box – "02600-10-1003104 - EXTERNALLY RESTRICTED FUNDS - BC Trefoil Educational Grant."

If assistance is required for a GGC Member to pay Membership Fees, update her status in Guiding, assistance with obtaining a PRC with BackCheck, etc; she can email GGC Member and Unit Support. Email is memberunitsupport@girlguides.ca. There are staff assigned to BC Members and Units.

As a reminder, all Adult Guiders would have received an email Sept. 16th on how to renew their Membership, and pay their fees. Please advise me if Guild Members require the links to complete this. If it has not been dealt with yet, some Members may find that they have been cancelled. Guild Leads should check their Rosters to ensure all Members are there.

Communication Chain Update

As you may know, I've been working on getting the Area Commissioners access to Guild Rosters so they can communicate with Guilds. We wanted the AC's to be able to contact Leads and Guild Members when assistance was needed. For Unit Guiders to know who to contact if assistance was needed. The National TG Liaison and my counterparts in other provinces have been working on this. To date nothing new to report about this access.

However, at BC Council, the concerns that communication to the Guilds was not happening at the Area level, there was a change suggested.

I can now report that Guild Leads should be contacting their ACs to ask for a list of Districts so that Guilds can offer assistance to District Commissioners directly. You may already know which District you are in, so that contact should happen easier for some. This was mentioned at the BC Council Meeting at the end of October. ACs know this request will be coming to them. If you need contact info for your AC, please let me know.

Member Information Management

A reminder to Guild Leads, continue to check your Guild Rosters on Member zone. You should keep them up to date to show which Members are in your Guild and who is not. It's also important to check on who has a PRC coming due or sometimes overdue. Also, it's a good way to see who has a significant Membership Pin coming up for presentation. Work with your Area Awards Advisor to ensure we honour our long-time Guiders.

The purpose of the Promoting Trefoil to Guiding Challenge is threefold:

• to create awareness about Trefoil Guilds within Guiding, to help you connect with your fellow Girl Guide members, and for you to have some fun in Guiding.

You must complete at least four activities within each category (for a total of 12) in order to achieve the Promoting Trefoil to Guiding Challenge (but you're welcome to

complete more!). Once you have completed them, email bc-trefoil@girlguides.ca to order a crest. We encourage you to do bulk crest orders with your Trefoil Guild/District/Area.

Don't forget to share your photos (with valid image release forms), We look forward to seeing what you get up to!

Sharing and Learning (Complete a minimum of 4 activities) 1. Tell three other Guiding members about your Trefoil Guild. 2. Attend a Guiding conference. 3. Complete an adult training session either in person or online. 4. Do some research on International Guiding and Trefoil Guilds (or their equivalent) around the world. Then visit a Pathfinder or Ranger Unit and share what you learned. 5. Invite current and retired Guiders to visit (and potentially join) your Trefoil Guild. 6. Plan or help with a District or Area-wide event for other Trefoil Guild members. 7. Help with cookie selling at a Unit/District event. 8. Provide IM'ing at Provincial events, i.e., Pathfinder Summit or Ranger Revolution.

Connecting with Each Other (Complete a minimum of 4 activities) 1. Brainstorm within your group and make a list of activities that you want to do as a Trefoil Guild for the year. 2. Connect with another Trefoil Guild in your Area. Consider doing a joint activity. 3. Create a closed or secret Facebook group page for your Guild and use it to stay in touch, plan activities and share pictures. 4. Organize a breakfast party with your Guild – PJs, pancakes, cheesy movies. 5. Participate in a cookie exchange – everyone brings a dozen cookies, with the recipe, and you all leave with an assortment of different cookies and new recipes. 6. Together, try something new that you've always wanted to do but never had the time— go karting, laser tag, rock climbing, kayaking ... the possibilities are endless. 7. Write a blog post about your Trefoil Guild and submit it to GirlGuidesCANBlog. 8. Post a selfie in uniform on Facebook or Instagram, and use the caption to describe one of your favourite Trefoil Guild memories. 9. Find a creative way to display the things you have done in your Trefoil Guild and send this to bc-trefoil@girlguides.ca to be included in the BC Bulletin.

Back to Basics (Complete a minimum of 4 activities) 1. Go camping with some of your fellow Trefoil members.

- 2. Offer to share a passion (gardening, crafting, scrapbooking, etc.) with an age-appropriate unit.
- 3. Participate a service project that helps those in your community.
- 4. Participate in or plan a campfire or singalong event.
- 5. Do a park clean up or spend some time volunteering in a community garden.

Encourage your Guild to earn this great BC Challenge. It is a lot of fun and will help us to retain Guiders and maybe even recruit some new members. Crests will be available at the BC Guide House. Crests will be \$3.00 for BC members. (\$3.50 for those outside BC)

Return to Guiding - Current Guidelines - reminder

Current Guidelines can be found on Memberzone. Some common questions being asked.

Is there a COVID-19 vaccination policy for the 2022-2023 Guiding year?

There is no vaccination policy in place for the 2022-2023 Guiding year.

How will self-assessments work?

To prioritize the health and safety of our members, all girls and volunteers attending in-person Guiding activities are required to complete the Self-Assessment Checklist prior to each in-person activity.

Guiders will confirm that every girl's family has completed the self-assessment when girls are dropped off prior to each in-person activity. Families do not have to print a copy of the assessment to bring with them.

Guiders will maintain an attendance list that will include completion of all self-assessments and must retain this sheet with the rest of their unit paperwork.

Guiders will confirm that your family has completed the self-assessment prior to each in-person activity when your girl is dropped off. Anyone who has not completed the self-assessment or had the self-assessment indicate that cannot attend in-person activities, may not participate until they can pass the self-assessment. The self-assessment checklist and attendance form are available on Member Zone. Thanks, Darlene

Gloria Le Gal, Guild Member from Last Bastion TG wrote this article about 20 years ago. It seemed fitting this week to read it at our Trefoil meeting and they asked that I send it on to you for the newsletter.

"When I am an old woman I shall wear purple with a red hat which doesn't go, and doesn't suit me." That is the opening for Jenny Joseph's poem *Warning*. She goes on to describe all the things she would like to do and is unable to do as a "proper" woman.

She should have joined Girl Guides. If she had, she wouldn't be waiting until she was old to have fun.

Personally, I have had 22 years of fun with Sparks, Brownies, Guides, Pathfinders, Senior Branch members and fellow Guiders. In the girl's estimation, I probably am old, having already pushed past the 50 mark. Guides and Pathfinders have joined me in the fun when I shot out the flame of a candle using a water pistol, made angels in the snow and walked the beach at San Josef at night marveling at the phosphorescence in the sand. I got the most outrageous bright green shawl at the Hornby Island Free Store only because we wanted to see if it would glow in the dark.

Brownies have tried to scare me with ghost stories and laughed at some of my craft attempts. Pathfinders and I have stood on the street in Vancouver, looking up at the sky and pointing, trying to see how many pedestrians would look up. We have slogged through mud on hikes and sang in rainstorms, laughing as we went. I have camped in sun and rain and slept with the whales at the Vancouver Aquarium.

Being a member of Girl Guides has given me the confidence to take on new challenges, to speak to groups of 100 or more, to share my Guiding knowledge as a trainer for new Guiders and to take on administrative roles. Throughout it all, I have had fun. The girls accept me in their fun and games and Guiders have become great friends.

So think of Jenny Joseph when she ends her poem "But maybe I ought to practice a little now? So people who know me are not too shocked and surprised when suddenly I am old, and start to wear purple."

Note: This was written as a newspaper article about 20 years ago, intended to promote Guiding. Now I wear Trefoil purple and the fun hasn't stopped.

We got together to see a play Mom's – Talking Turkey and dinner out.




<u>Kingswood Night Owl Trefoil Guild (KNOTs)</u> – Victoria

Later we traveled over to Vancouver to see close to 50exquisite floral displays in the Downtown core for the Christmas Season


