

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# **ORANGE CRAFTS AND ACTIVITIES**

# 1. Oranges

### 1a. Orange Bird Feeder

#### **Supplies**

- · chopsticks or thin dowelling
- large orange
- birdseed
- twine
- spoon

#### **Directions**

- 1. Cut the large orange in half.
- 2. With a spoon, carefully scoop out with the inside of the orange, leaving the peel intact.
- 3. Put chopsticks through the orange in an X, piercing through near the bottom of the orange.
- 4. Tie the twine on to the chopsticks, close to the orange, to create a hanger.
- 5. Fill the orange with birdseed, hang it outside, sit back & watch for birds!


#### 1b. Pomander Ornament

Orange pomanders freshen your home, and are a traditional ornament.

#### **Supplies**

- firm orange (NOT Mandarin!)
- whole cloves
- round toothpicks
- tape
- ribbon

- 1. Wrap two strips of tape around the orange, top to bottom, to mark where the ribbon will go.
- 2. Poke the orange with the toothpick where you want the cloves to go, then insert a whole clove in each hole (it is easier for the girls to use a toothpick first, rather than just pushing the clove through the peel). Make sure not to poke through the tape.
- 3. Create any design you like using cloves on the orange stripes, a flower, smiley face... use your imagination!
- 4. To hang, remove the tape and wrap the ribbon around the orange. Tie at the top and make a loop.



### 2. The Lorax

The Lorax by Dr. Seuss is a great tool to teach the girls about taking care of our Earth. You can read the story and then make your own Lorax. Make some Truffula trees to be beside him too!

#### **Supplies**

- orange paper cup
- yellow pipe cleaner for mustache and eyebrows
- orange pipe cleaner for arms
- 2 more colours of pipe cleaner for tree trunk
- · 2 googly eyes
- feathers (or a piece of fluffy boa)
- orange silk flower
- small orange pom-pom
- · scissors to cut pipe cleaners
- tacky glue

- Start with the cup upside down. Poke the stem of the flower through the base of the cup.
- 2. Glue the eyes and nose (pompom) in place.
- 3. Shape a yellow mustache using pipe cleaner and glue it on below the nose.
- 4. Shape two eyebrows using pipe cleaner, and glue them above the eyes.
- Poke two holes in the cup, and feed an orange pipe cleaner through to create arms. Trim to length, and shape as desired.
- 6. Twist two colours of pipe cleaners together to make a tree trunk.
- 7. Holding the shafts of several feathers together, twist one end of the tree truck tightly around the feather to secure them in place.
- 8. Attach one arm's hand to the tree.



### 3. Goldfish

#### 3a. Goldfish Tray Favours

Goldfish are actually orange so you could use goldfish crackers to make a snack, or make a cute tray favor.

#### **Supplies**

- small plastic craft bags
- goldfish crackers
- cardstock

#### **Directions**


- 1. Fill the bags with goldfish crackers.
- 2. Place a coloured, folded piece of cardstock over the top of the baggie as a header.
- 3. Embellish with a circle seal that reads "A small o'fish'al welcome from: ."

#### 3b. Goldfish Windsock

### **Supplies**

- orange crepe or tissue paper
- toilet paper tube
- orange crepe streamers, orange flagging tape, or plastic cut into strips
- alue
- googly eyes
- string

- 1. Cover the tube in the orange paper using glue.
- 2. Cut two fins and glue to the sides.
- 3. Cut long pieces of streamers or plastic strips and attach to the end of tube.
- 4. Add googly eyes at the top of the tube on either side.
- 5. Glue or tape string to the inside of the top of tube and attach the other end of the string to a pole where the wind will catch it, or to a dowel so the girls can run and make it sail somewhat like a kite.



#### 3c. Goldfish Bowl

#### **Supplies**

- cardstock or paper plate cut into a fishbowl shape
- blue watercolour paint, paint brushes, water
- construction paper of various colours include orange for goldfish!
- scissors
- glue stick

#### **Directions**

- 1. Using watercolour paint, paint "water" onto the fishbowl.
- Create fish (especially goldfish!) and other sea creatures using the construction paper. Variation: glue goldfish crackers to the fish bowl.
- 3. Glue the fish onto the fishbowl.





Have some messy fun with Cheetos!

#### **Supplies**

- Cheetos
- shower cap
- shaving cream
- chopsticks

- 1. Cheeto Head: have one girl per team put on a shower cap, then spray shaving cream over it. See how many Cheetos each team can land on the cap in a minute.
- 2. Face the Cheeto: have the girls sit on chairs, tilt their heads back, place a cheesie on their forehead and see who can manage to get the cheesie into their mouth without using hands.
- 3. Chopstick Cheeto Relay Race: In teams, relay race style, have the girls move cheesies from one end of the room to the other end using chopsticks.





# 5. Tiger Bag Puppet

#### **Supplies**

- paper bag
- orange paint (optional) and paint brushes
- black, orange and white paper
- pipe cleaners
- scissors
- glue

#### **Directions**

- (Optional) paint the bag orange (sometimes you can buy orange bags).
   You can use a brown bag without painting, if you choose.
- 2. Use the black paper to add triangle "stripes" and a nose.
- 3. Use orange paper to make ears and paws.
- 4. Use white paper to make eyes.
- 5. Use pipe cleaners for whiskers.
- 6. Be creative!

# 6. Pumpkins

### 6a. Mini Pumpkin Decorating

If it's the right time of year, get mini pumpkins for the girls to decorate; rather than carving, have them add details to create a face.

### **Supplies**

- mini pumpkins
- acrylic paint & paintbrushes or permanent markers
- feathers, pompoms, ribbons, yarn, etc.
- tacky glue

#### **Directions**

Be creative! Use craft supplies to decorate your mini pumpkin in any way you like.





#### 6b. Pumpkin Pots

#### **Supplies**

- terra-cotta pot
- black and orange acrylic paint
- paintbrushes
- Modge Podge or acrylic sealing spray

#### **Directions**

- Paint the entire outside of the pot orange and let it to dry (note: if your pot is already orange, you can skip this step).
- 2. Add face details using black paint.
- 3. When dry, seal with Modge Podge or an acrylic sealing spray.
- 4. Optional: fill with soil and a plant!



### 6c. Pumpkin Bowling

#### **Supplies**

- small pumpkins, about 4 to 6 inches in diameter
- toilet paper tubes or plastic drink bottles decorated to look like ghosts (cover with white tissue, secured with an elastic band, draw eyes on)

#### **Directions**

- 1. Stack the ghost-pins up as desired.
- 2. Measure a throwing line, several feet from the pins.
- 3. Give each girl 2 attempts to knock down the pins by rolling a pumpkin towards them.

### 6d. Pumpkin Volcanoes

For a science-themed event, use jack-o-lanterns as the vehicle for volcano explosions of vinegar and baking soda.

Note: as with all science experiments, try this at home first before demonstrating with the girls!

### **Supplies**

- small pumpkin already carved and scooped out
- baking soda
- food colouring (optional)
- warm water

- dish soap
- vinegar
- large baking pan to fit the pumpkin in

#### **Directions**

- 1. Put the pumpkin into a baking pan or a sink to catch the overflow this can get messy!
- 2. Fill the pumpkin about ½ full with warm water.
- 3. Add about 5 drops of dish soap and a couple of drops of food colouring and about ½ cup of vinegar.
- 4. Mix in a few tablespoons of baking soda and watch what happens!

What's happening? The vinegar (an acid) and baking soda (a base) react to form carbon dioxide (a gas). The bubbles expand and make a pumpkin eruption! The dish soap helped to make even more bubbles. You can try adding more baking soda to see if there is any unreacted vinegar left in the solution. If not, add more vinegar!

#### 6e. Jack-o-Lantern Beanbag Games

#### **Supplies**

- plastic jack-o-lantern pails
- beanbags

#### **Directions**

- 1. Target practice: Set up the pails so they vary in length from the throwing line. Award more points for landing in further pails. Alternately, line the pails up on a flat surface and try to knock them down by throwing beanbags at them.
- 2. Golf: Set up a course with markers showing where to throw the beanbags from into the pails.
- 3. Catch: In pairs, have one girl hold a pail, and another girl try to throw the beanbag into the pail. Move farther away with each throw.
- 4. Marco Polo: in pairs, blindfold both girls, having them stand a set distance apart. Spin both girls around. One girl has a beanbag and the other has a pail. The girl with the beanbag calls out "Marco" and the girl with the pail calls out "Polo". Then the girl with the beanbag tries to get it into the pail based on where she hears the voice coming from.
- 5. Relay: Balance a beanbag on a body part (arm, head, shoulder, etc) then drop it into a pail at the other end. Repeat until all girls in a team have dropped the beanbag into the pail.

Use your imagination (or a search of the internet!) to come up with more beanbag game ideas.

### 6f. Pumpkin Turkeys

#### **Supplies**

- mini pumpkins
- feathers
- orange, red and brown felt
- googly eyes
- glue

#### **Directions**

- Cut out all felt pieces: a turkey head/neck/chest from the brown felt, a beak from the orange felt, and a waddle from the red felt.
- 2. Glue googly eyes, beak and waddle onto the brown felt.
- 3. Glue the turkey head onto the mini pumpkin.
- 4. Glue feathers onto the other side of the pumpkin as a tail.



#### **Supplies**

- baby food jar
- · orange and black tissue paper
- scissors
- Modge Podge & paintbrush
- LED tea light

- 1. Cut or tear orange tissue into small pieces.
- 2. Paint Modge Podge onto the outside of the baby food jar.
- 3. Put small pieces of orange tissue paper onto the jar. Make sure you cover the outside of the jar completely.
- 4. Cut or tear black tissue paper to make facial features (eyes & mouth).
- 5. Gently apply a little more Modge Podge onto the orange tissue where you want the facial features, then add the black tissue where desired.
- 6. Allow the Modge Podge to dry.
- 7. Put an LED tea light into the jar.



### 7. Carrots

### 7a. Carrot Tray Favours

#### **Supplies**

- clear triangle icing bag
- orange treats (jelly beans or fish crackers work well)
- green ribbon

#### **Directions**


- 1. Fill the bags with the treats.
- 2. Tie closed with multiple pieces of green curling ribbon.

### 7b. Carrot Whittling

#### **Supplies**

- carrots
- vegetable peelers

- 1. Girls (the "whittlers") must be sitting where they can be supervised.
- 2. Show the girls the correct whittling motion always stroke away from yourself and others on the carrot, and also off of your knee.
- 3. Make sure they have a strong grip on the carrot as they stroke it with the peeler.
- 4. Being able to whittle a carrot using a vegetable peeler is a great confidence-booster for kids!





### 8. Autumn Leaves

### 8a. Pinecone Turkey

### **Supplies**

- leaves
- pinecone
- orange construction paper, felt or fun foam for beak
- googly eyes
- · tacky glue

#### **Directions**

- 1. Glue the eyes and beak on to the front of the pinecone.
- 2. Glue the leaves onto the back of the pinecone.

### 8b. Turkey Leaf Collage

#### **Supplies**

- leaves
- paper
- glue stick

#### **Directions**

- 1. Arrange the leaves on the paper to form a turkey.
- 2. Attach the leaves with a glue stick.
- 3. Alternately, use the leaves for the tail only, and make the head and body using construction paper.

### 8c. Leaf Rubbings

#### **Supplies**

- leaves
- paper
- crayon (orange, yellow and brown shades)

- 1. Find a leaf that has a nice texture, but isn't so brittle that it crumbles when touched.
- 2. With the back side of the leaf facing up (the part which has the "veins"), place the leaf on a hard surface, such as a table.
- 3. Put a piece of paper over top of the leaf. You could hold the paper in place by taping it down.
- 4. Using the side of the crayon, gently colour over the leaf. You could use several colours for each leaf.

### 8d. Crayon Melt Pictures

#### **Supplies**

- wax paper
- crayons in various shades of orange, yellow and brown
- pencil sharpeners
- scissors
- iron & ironing board
- paper towel (to protect your iron)
- · leaf template
- pencil

#### **Directions**

- 1. Cut a piece of wax paper to about 8.5" x 11".
- 2. Using the scissors or a pencil sharpener, shave the crayons onto the wax paper. Don't use too much crayon you only need a thin layer.
- 3. Place another piece of wax paper on top of the crayon shavings to make a "sandwich". Fold the edges over so that the crayons don't leak out when you iron.
- 4. On the ironing board, place the sandwich onto a piece of paper towel, then put another piece of paper towel on top (to protect the ironing board and the iron).
- 5. With the iron on low heat, slowly melt the crayon.
- 6. Allow to cool before removing your melted crayon creation.
- 7. Put the melted crayon/wax paper onto the leaf template, trace and cut.
- 8. You could make several leaves and hang them as a mobile, or create a garland, or laminate several together to make a placemat.

## 9. Safety Cones

#### 9a. Race or Obstacle Course

### **Supplies**

- small orange safety cones (can be purchased at dollar stores, a great addition to your unit's supplies!)
- rope
- hula hoops
- anything else you can think of to use in an obstacle course!



- 1. Do all kinds of active games using small orange safety cones as your start and finish lines or as part of your obstacle course. Some ideas follow.
- 2. Weave: set up the cones so that the girls must weave in and out of them from one end to the other.

- 3. Tightrope: lay out a rope between two cones have the girls "balance" on the rope, walking in a straight line from one end to the other.
- 4. Crawl: army crawl from one cone to another.
- 5. Limbo: balance a broomstick on two cones, propped up on chairs, then have the girls limbo under it.
- 6. Jump: balance a broomstick on two cones on the ground, then jump over it.
- 7. Ring toss: throw hula hoops to land around the cones.



### 9b. Safety Cone Hat Craft

### **Supplies**

- cone template (below)
- orange felt
- googly eyes
- scissors
- tacky glue
- safety pin

- 1. Cut the two pieces of felt using the template. Make a small notch at the base of the dotted line.
- Apply glue to the small triangle bordered by the dotted line (from the edge to the notch). Glue the felt into a cone shape, overlapping to the dotted line.
- 3. Put a bead of glue around the base of the cone, and glue it to the square.
- 4. Glue on googly eyes.
- 5. Attach a safety pin at the top.





### 10. Basketballs

Name a ball that's orange and you will get "basketball" – this is a great opportunity to incorporate active games using a basketball or orange play balls. Find a variety of game ideas online: https://www.google.ca/#q=games+using+basketballs



### 11. Monarch Butterflies

### 11a. Clothespin Butterfly Craft

### **Supplies**

- orange tissue paper
- black pipe cleaners
- clothespins
- markers
- googly eyes
- glue

- 1. Cut tissue into about 6" x 4" rectangles. Use two rectangles per butterfly.
- 2. Draw dots or other designs onto the tissue.
- 3. Layer the two pieces of tissue on top of each other, then gather in the center (midway along the long edge). Clip using the clothespin.
- 4. Cut the pipe cleaner to about 6" long, and shape into antennae. Clip it in with the clothespin.
- 5. Glue eyes on.



#### 11b. Butterfly Mask

#### **Supplies**

- mask template (find one online https://www.google.ca/#q=monarch+bu tterfly+mask+template&tbm=isch)
- cardstock
- scissors
- markers
- anything else you would like to decorate with – stickers, glitter glue, etc.
- elastic string
- stapler

#### **Directions**

- 1. Print the mask template onto cardstock.
- 2. Have the girls decorate the mask as desired.
- 3. Cut out eye holes.
- 4. Attach elastic string to the sides using staples.



#### **Supplies**

- · popsicle sticks
- glue
- orange yarn
- scissors
- black pipe cleaner
- googly eyes

- Glue two popsicle sticks together to form an "x". Do this in advance so that the glue dries before starting.
- Starting at the centre of the "x", wrap the yarn around the popsicle sticks – cover both sides of the "x" to make wings. Tie the yarn off when finished.
- 3. Cut the pipe cleaner in half, and fold one piece in half to form the antennae.
- 4. Wrap the other piece of pipe cleaner through the base of the antennae, then around the centre of the "x" to make the butterfly body.
- 5. Glue on googly eyes.



### 11d. Butterfly Snack Bags

### **Supplies**

- plastic resealable snack bags
- mini carrots or goldfish crackers
- clothespin
- black pipe cleaner
- · googly eyes
- glue

#### **Directions**

 Decorate the clothespin by gluing on eyes and allowing to dry. You could decorate the clothespin with markers or glitter glue, as well. Allow to completely dry before moving on.



- 2. Fill the snack bags with the carrots or goldfish crackers (or other orange coloured snack) don't fill them full, as you need space to gather the baggie in the middle. Use about ½ cup of snack for each snack-sized bag.
- 3. Separate the snack in the bag into two parts, and twist a pipe cleaner between the two sections. Form the pipe cleaner into antennae.
- 4. Clip the clothespin over the centre of the bag.

### 12. Fire

You could include a campfire station at your event where the girls sing songs around a real or fake campfire. Make your own fake fire to sing around. Here is just one way to do this.

### **Supplies**

- circular base could be a sturdy paper plate, an old CD or a circle of cereal box cardboard
- small rocks
- orange, yellow and red tissue paper, cut into equal sized squares, about 6"x6"
- LED tea light
- glue

- 1. Glue rocks around the edge of the circular base.
- Layer the tissue paper squares on top of each other, so that their centres line up, but so they are rotated on top of one another (fanned like a star). Put a small amount of glue between each piece of tissue at the centre.
- 3. Place an LED tea light in the centre of the tissue. Don't glue it on, as you need to be able to access the power switch!
- 4. Gather the tissue up around the tea light, then place it on some glue on the base.
- 5. Allow to dry before use.
