# **Membership Matters!**

Did you know that while NS is a small province (geographically and demographically) we have the 4<sup>th</sup> largest membership in Canada? NS does great things and it shows!

Over the past 5 years, NS girl membership typically runs between 4,700-4,730. 2017 girl membership was 4,718 and 2018's was 4,561 which represented a decrease of 3% or 157 girls, and unfortunately it looks like we are on track for another decrease this year.

Last year Girls 1<sup>st</sup> was launched and, based on year end reviews, the girls love it! Guiders may still be working out a few kinks, but for the most part there is favorable reviews as well. The new uniform provides a lower cost option that girls can continue to wear when they leave one Branch and go to another, camping and travel continue to be a strong part of our program. We have passionate and dedicated women, like you, who mentor and empower the girls so how can we make Guiding a viable option for more girls and women?

We know there are more and more options for girls and women today, so I have to ask, what's going on and why aren't the girls coming our way? Why is Guiding not on the top of the list for them?

My focus will always be The Girl, after all, where would we be with out them, but we need your help.

Over the next couple of months, you will be asked for your input via a series of short survey's. PLEASE take a few minutes and respond- we can't address concerns unless we get your feedback – your voice is critical to our success.

While we have had some great women step up to join the team, we are still looking to fill the following roles:

**Member Services Coordinator** – provides assistance and support to the Membership, Public Relations, Training, Link and Trefoil Advisers – experience as an adviser is ideal but not necessary.

**Active Living -** promotes active living activities through N.S. Girl Guides programming for girls and guiders.

Please keep in mind that there is also a huge need for women to fill some of the vacant or upcoming vacancies for District Commissioners or District Treasurers, Safe Guide Assessors, Provincial Finance Committee Members, etc.
