There is no doubt that this Province has some very dedicated Guiders working at the local level to provide fun and dynamic program to our girls however in order for our Province to grow and prosper it also takes women who are willing to get involved at the Provincial level. A Province doesn't run itself and despite many attempts over the past two years we have been unable to convince women that Provincial level positions are a great opportunity. Working and learning from a super group of women, knowing that you are contributing to a wonderful organization and ultimately enhancing the experience of the girls are just a few of the benefits of taking on a Provincial position. Of course there is a time commitment and depending on the position, that commitment varies. I would venture to guess that for the last two years most Provincial Guiding events have been initiated and carried out by the same 20 some people. In a Province with almost 500 adult Guiders this practice cannot continue. You can imagine that these same people are getting tired, not to mention that without an infusion of new people, with new ideas, all operations tend to get old. Month after month we advertise positions in the Piccolo to no avail. Now I am trying again. Perhaps there is a reluctance based on a lack of understanding of what is involved. I am including a short summary of our current needs. Don't be afraid to contact us for more information. Perhaps you know a woman outside of Guiding who could fill one of these positions, maybe they are just waiting to be asked. Everyone has a talent to share, please lend a hand.

Public Relations Adviser: The goals of the PR Adviser are to develop a comprehensive public relations plan for Guiding in Québec and to provide support to district councils in their advertising efforts in the areas of recruitment and cookies. The PR adviser is a Member of the Provincial Advisers Committee (PAC).

Cookie Adviser: The goals of the Cookie Adviser are to provide each girl Member with a meaningful cookie selling experience, to provide every Unit Guider and parent with access to pertinent cookie selling resources and to develop a plan for a "cookie program" that will capitalize on the "business experience" of the girls. The cookie adviser is a Member of the Provincial Advisers Committee (PAC).

Ranger Specialist: This is an awesome position as you get to work, plan, camp and have fun with a group of young ladies who already know how to pitch a tent and cook. The ranger specialist position falls under the program adviser and she would be a member of the program adviser's committee.

Lones Specialist: The main purpose of this position is to be a Guider to a girl(s) who is not able to attend meetings. You would be required – through emails and phone calls - to help this girl through her program work and, if possible, ensure that she would be able to camp with a district within her geographical location. The Lones specialist position falls under the program adviser and she would be a member of the program adviser's committee.


Link Specialist: The goals of the link specialist are to engage and support Link Members to become or remain lifelong Guiders and to encourage Ranger-aged girls to join Link. You would also be providing an opportunity for these girls to stay in touch with Guiding as many of them are university students from out of town.

PR Team members: Members of the PR team will work with the PR Adviser and Guiders to promote Guiding in Quebec by showcasing all of our wonderful achievements in the media.


Membership Growth team members: Members of the Quebec Membership Growth Team will work with the Registration and Recruitment Adviser to encourage districts to recruit new members and to offer the DC's ideas and support to encourage Guiders to continue to be Members of Guiding.

Wa-Thik-Ane property committee members: This new committee will work on the care and promotion of Camp Wa-Thik-Ane under the direction of the Wa-Thik-Ane committee chair.

Tips for a Successful Registration Event

Sometimes it helps to have a quick check list when planning any event. Here are a few quick tips for planning and executing a successful registration event.

PR

- Make sure that you promote your event in as many high traffic areas as possible. Search out opportunities for free publicity such as a PSA's – Public Service Announcements.
- Submit your event to the national website at <http://www.girlguides.ca/events>. This will provide Information to the public about your event.
- Where possible distribute to schools, community centres etc. information about your event and promotional material for girls and parents.
- Send out a press release to your local newspaper about your event. A media relations Checklist is available on the site under National Registration Week in Member Zone. If you are interested in a Press Release Template for your event please contact Pamela Rice at panne_rice@hotmail.com.

At your Event....

- Make sure that you have all promotional material available in sufficient quantities and with an appropriate language mix
- A registration greeter is desirable. If you can, post an approachable member of your District at the door who can greet everyone coming in the door, provide information sought by the parent and girl and direct them to the right location for completing their registration.
- Make sure that those participating in registering girls have all the materials and information they need to efficiently complete the registration. First impressions are important, so being organized makes the parent(s) feel comfortable!
- Make sure that the registrant (girl and parent) has all the information she needs before departing regarding when the first meeting will be (if at all possible), where and who their contact is for the unit.
- If you can, have some of the older girls in your District provide a child play area for siblings.
- Provide any follow-up required in a timely manner.
- Some unsold Girl Guide cookies? This is an opportunity to use them up.

Screening

With September coming up fast, Units will be opening and there will be new Potential Members (PMBR) to be screened.

Please remember:

- The date on a PMBR's application is her join date. Please send it in as quickly as possible. This puts her in iMIS and on the *Canadian Guider* mailing list.
- If you need help doing references contact me (see contact info below)
- The Orientation to Guiding Training must be done in the first 4 weeks – either on-line or someone does it with her. If the latter let the Office know the date and who did it with the PMBR.

The Police Record Check must be done as soon as possible. The Adult Member Support Manual Module 2 - Screening states on page 8 under STEP 5:

A potential Member **can only participate in activities with girls on a regular or ongoing basis if she has obtained a PRC that meets GGC's requirements.** Pending completion of her Membership screening, a PMBR may not be in any kind of a supervisory role with girls without a clear PRC.

Police Record Check Renewals

District Commissioners have a list of all Guiders in their District whose PRC will come up for renewal between September 1, 2010 to August 31, 2011.

Letters go out to Guiders 6 months prior to expiration. At three months prior to expiration the National Office sends you a reminder letter. Once you get the letter from Province, please do your renewal right away.
