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Quebec Council announces the forming of a **Quebec provincial patrol** to attend the



Irish Girl Guides - CAMP 101 – Lough Key 2012.

The event plans include a short visit to London, including a stay at Pax Lodge, the flight to Dublin, a week at the International camp in Ireland, and then a few more days for some exploration of the Emerald Isle before returning to Canada.

This trip is open to **all Quebec girl members** who are currently Pathfinders, or are Rangers who will not turn 18 until after August 1st, 2012. Between 8 and 10 youth participants will be selected for this event. Bilingual versions of event information, application forms, and cost estimates will appear in the January Piccolo, and will be e-mailed in December, directly to all Pathfinders and Rangers and their Guiders, as appear in iMIS.

The deadline for applications is **St Patrick's Day, March 17th 2011**.
Applications may be submitted in French or in English

Huggies has partnered with Food Banks Canada. Huggies will be donating 2 million diapers to Food Banks across Canada. The GGC partnership with Huggies is to increase awareness of the on-going need for mothers to have clean diapers for their children, also to encourage Units collecting for Food Banks to include diapers in their donations as part of the National Service Project.

GGC is not aware how, when or where Huggies donations to Food Banks will occur - you may receive a call from your local media for a photo-op. Photo-ops are great PR tools and a way to spread the word about diaper collections by Units. To date Units across Canada have collected over 3,000 diapers for food banks - please ensure units include the diaper count in their food bank contributions. See national website to register.

Provincial Office Holiday Hours

The office will be closed for the holidays from Friday, December 24th, 2010, until Monday, January 3rd, 2011. From Monday, January 3rd until Friday, January 14th, 2011, the Provincial office staff will take phone calls and answer e-mails in the morning only and will work on sorting and packing the office in the afternoon.

Canadian World Friendship Fund

The CWFF was established in 1945. It provides financial support for WAGGGS, for Mutual Aid schemes and for the four World Centres. Contributions are made to other Guiding countries to help them establish or re-establish Guiding or in times of natural disaster. Financial support is also provided through the fund for the travel expenses of Canadians selected to attend international events, and travel expenses for guests from Member Countries visiting Canada.

Every year around Thinking Day, February 22, we are asked to make a donation of at least one dollar per member to the CWFF. National has asked that we return to the practice of holding special fundraisers for this purpose.

One dollar per member is not much, and you can simply have a meeting around Thinking Day on which you explain what the CWFF does to the girls and ask them to make a donation.

Another more involved idea is to make a penny bank with the girls, and add a few pennies each day. It won't take long to get up to one dollar or more! A week should be enough, depending what you put pennies in for. Send a note home explaining to the parents that the goal is about one dollar, and what the CWFF is for. Pick a few of the following ideas to get you started, or come up with your own.

Each day put in one cent for:

- each girl in your unit
- each language you know how to say "hello" in
- the number of people in your family
- the number of girls in your class at school
- each badge you have earned (specify in your level, or for Rangers or adults, make it your Guiding career!)
- each leader you have known as a Spark, Brownie, Guide, etc.
- each camp or sleepover you have ever attended
- each country whose food you like (try to include sneaky ones like pizza and pasta from Italy, which we almost consider our own)
- each good turn you do today
- each time you say "hello" or "hi" or "bonjour" etc. to someone today
- each time you go in or out of your house today
- every person you know who speaks a language other than French or English
- each VHF or DVD movie you own which shows a different country (include fairy tales!)
- every country you can name

Don't forget that for a specific purpose fundraiser like this, the full amount (at least) collected must be passed on to your district/province. There are dedicated columns on the spreadsheets for CWFF under Expenses and Revenues.

Treasurers' Trove

Signing Officers:

If you haven't updated them yet, please do so now. This must be done for all unit and district accounts every year. This must show in District minutes, although if there are no changes, you should not have to visit the bank.

Budget for Districts:

Please include it with your next District Minutes. It is a good idea for units to do a budget too, but not required.

Year-end:

Year-end is Dec 31, which is coming soon, so make sure your books are up to date before the Holiday rush! That will make it easier to wind things up for Dec 31, when they must be closed for review.

Financial Reviews:

Unit books should be reviewed within the district, as long as those doing the review meet the requirements for independent reviewers in the Handbooks. District Treasurers should send the Annual Financial Reports and copies of the Financial Review Checklists to the Provincial Office.

District books will be reviewed by the District Treasurers at a Book Review evening this year. Please send all documentation (see list in Treasurer Handbooks) to the office by **Jan 31, 2010**. We will let you know when we will meet.

Trefoil Guilds: The financial books of Trefoil Guilds with their own bank accounts should also be reviewed at year-end. They should be treated as Unit books and reviewed within the District.

AM 1 (New Guiders)	SAFE GUIDE (NOTE: this session is mandatory for all Guiders within 12 months of joining as an adult) Safe Guide is a resource session designed to help you plan exciting programs and interact with parents/guardians, other Guiders and the community as you deliver girl-focused activities. With step-by-step how-to guidelines for popular Guiding activities, Safe Guide provides Unit Guiders with an understanding of the importance of the document and its related policies and procedures. Included are: risk factors and risk levels, basic concepts of risk management and a process for assessing the risks of specific Guiding activities. Safe Guide is a mandatory training for all Guiders. It must be completed within 12 months of a new Guider's iMIS join date.
AM 2 (New Guiders at all levels)	PUTTING THE PIECES TOGETHER (Susan Sayer & Nancy Shaw) This training is the final piece of the Unit Guider Stream Training Module. Guiders will develop a sense of their own leadership style, understand different models of leadership, increase their skills and confidence as a leader, and understand group dynamics and behavior management to help coordinate a group of girls. If this is your final module, you will receive your Unit Guider Pin.
AM 3 (Spark, Brownie & Guide Guiders)	BRINGING WAGGGS TO YOUNGER GIRLS' PROGRAMS (Valerie Zaloum) Bring the World to your meetings and events! Ideas from WAGGGS and around the globe for girls of all ages – Live the feeling that we are all part of the 10 million strong! Focus will be on Spark, Brownie and Guide Program activities – but all welcome!
AM 4 (All)	GIRL EMPOWERMENT AND GIRLS UNITED BULLYING PREVENTION (TBA - Guest) Girls today need to know how to get along with others, how to build strong connections with each other, how to be a support for each other and how to build strong, rewarding friendships with other girls. This is enrichment training for Guiders that will give them a deeper understanding of how to recognize social aggression and take action to provide girls with safe places. Adults who are untrained rarely aid children who are bullied.

AM 6 (Pathfinder & Ranger Guiders & Rangers)	GUIDING PATHFINDERS AND RANGERS TO SUCCESS (Sinclair Harris & Heather Martin) This session will explore ways to enable Pathfinders and Rangers to be successful in leading themselves. The focus of both programs is self direction and peer leadership. As Guiders we need to find a balance between process and results. When planning program, service projects, camps and events...do they need a leader? an advisor? a coach? or do they need to learn from their mistakes? A session for Guiders and Rangers prepared to recognize that what is important is..“We did it ourselves!”
