It will only take an hour or two at most if you've kept up to date all year, as I am sure many of you have!

Please make sure you include all supporting documents with your financial books when you give them to your District Treasurer (Units) or the Provincial Office (Districts) for review. This is the biggest cause for delays in getting the books back to you, especially as we review the District books.

Remember that you must use independent reviewers (no signing officers, relations or business connections) for the Unit books. Usually this can be done at a book review party of all the Unit Treasurers.


Safe Guide

2-3 yellow level Safe Guide Assessors needed

If you are familiar with the current Safe Guide document, and have recent experience planning yellow level activities, why not consider joining the Quebec Safe Guide Assessor team. The Yellow Assessor's role is to provide acknowledgement to the Responsible Guider that the activity she is planning is within the Safe Guide parameters. The work of a Safe Guide Assessor is done primarily through email, although some telephone follow-up may be required. Assessor orientation is required. A support system is provided. Time required varies, however you should expect an average of one assessment per week, with somewhat more during peak Spring and Fall camping seasons.


Directions (Map and Bus Lines)



From your Camping Committee



CLOTHING KEEPS WINTER FUN!

Taking your girls outside at Winter Camp or for a day or meeting of winter fun? Don't forget to discuss layering and proper winter clothing - Some ideas for any season to help girls understand layering -Apply them yourself as well – you will have more fun if you are dressed properly!

Base Layer - long underwear, polyester PJ's, old tights with the feet cut off, turtleneck Insulating Layer – light sweater, vest, fleece top/bottoms, sweatpants etc...

Outer Laver – Wind & weather resistant (shell, pants, ski suit etc..)

ALL LAYERS COUNT - These layers can apply to hats, scarves, mitts, socks and boots as well... put on your hat with a hood over it to keep yourself dry and keep your hat on! Wear a pair of thin gloves under warm mitts in case you need to fiddle with a zipper.

HOW IT WORKS - The basics of layering is that the bottom layer wicks (or absorbs) the moisture from your skin, the middle layer lets the moisture pass out while creating a pocket of warm air and the outer layer lets the humidity out and keeps the wind and

wet (snow or wet) weather from getting in. However, they only work if you keep dry inside - Let the girls take off a layer or chose a lighter middle layer when doing active games or sports, and put the warmer layer back on when they stop or are doing lighter activities. They will get a better understanding of how the principles work, if they are comfortable and enjoying their experience outdoors.



REMEMBER TO BE PARENT-FRIENDLY: Be sure the girls go home with ideas on how to make what they own work within the layering principles – not that mom and dad need to go out and buy new fancy gear. Even the old worn ski suit can be useful with a raincoat over top or a fleece underneath! Don't forget to lend and borrow if needed!

some ideas

- Make Paper Dolls have the girls create different layers of clothing from coloured paper or fabric
- Create a Relay with catalogue pictures or actual items of clothing, have the girls place them in the correct order, including a discard pile (or other season symbol)
- Use a "Blubber Glove" to illustrate insulation properties put Vaseline between two light plastic gloves. Put your hand inside the inner glove and squish the Vaseline around to protect part of your hand – put your hand into a snow bank (controlled & supervised environment). The girls will quickly understand how the Vaseline creates an insulating barrier. This can help to explain why animals increase in fat in the colder months.
- Make Baked Alaska (Baked ice cream on cake with a meringue cover which insulates the ice cream and keeps it frozen in a 350° oven.) Google Baked Alaska Recipes and chose your favourite
- Sit-upon survey- Have the girls select a variety of sit-upon (or sleeping mattress) options including an air mattress, blue foam, tarp, stadium cushion, camp chair, newspaper bundle, sleeping bag, fur if you can get it etc... Have each girl sit on her selected option for a predetermined period of time – the concept of sitting eliminates a lot of the insulation in the bottom of the ski suit, therefore the cushion becomes the barrier. Have the girls assess which is most effective in keeping them dry, warm, long term use, leave at home... etc.. This can be useful if girls are planning a sleep-out in winter as it will help them understand what to bring.
