All About Wa-Thik-Ane

Où se trouve le Camp Wa-Thik-Ane?

Situé à Morin Heights, au Québec, à environ 85 km au nord de Montréal, le Camp Wa-Thik-Ane (WAH-tic-ANNIE) est établi sur un magnifique terrain de plus de 120 hectares de nature sauvage sur les rives du lac Bouchette.

Quelles sont les normes de santé et sécurité en vigueur?

Tous les programmes sont planifiés et l'encadrement est assuré conformément aux méthodes du *Guide Sécurité* des Guides du Canada. Tous les aspects liés à la santé et à la sécurité sont gérés par des secouristes et des surveillantes-sauveteures qualifiées.

Qui va s'occuper de ma fille?

Des bénévoles adultes ayant fait l'objet d'une vérification des antécédents complète et pleinement qualifiées seront responsables de toutes les filles. Les ratios de supervision seront établis conformément aux méthodes du *Guide Sécurité* des Guides du Canada. Les responsables dirigeront le programme principalement en anglais et traduiront en français au besoin.

Où ma fille va-t-elle dormir?

Toutes les campeuses dormiront dans de tentes de toile montées sur des plateformes de bois permanentes. Les campeuses qui participent au camp Wee Camp Together seront placées avec leur accompagnatrice adulte et un autre duo de campeuses. Toutes les autres campeuses partageront leur tente avec deux ou trois autres filles de leur âge.

Ma fille peut-elle être placée dans une tente avec son amie?

Sur la demande d'inscription au camp, il y a un endroit où indiquer si une fille vient au camp avec une amie particulière. Toutefois les plus grands groupes peuvent devoir se répartir deux par deux.

What if a camper has special needs, disabilities or dietary restrictions?

Site Guiders will do their best to accommodate special needs. However, to help us provide the best possible experience for campers please note any special requirements on the application form in the "Other" section. This helps us to identify special needs or menus a camper might require.

Do I send a deposit with the application?

Yes. A 50% non-refundable deposit must accompany the application form. Payment can be made by credit card (Mastercard or Visa), certified cheque or money order. (payable to Girl Guides of Canada-Quebec Council) Balance of payment is due by June 1, 2010. Camp reservations not paid in full by June 1 will automatically be cancelled and your deposit will not be refunded. Payment in full can be made immediately.

What is your refund policy?

Requests for refunds of camp fees must be submitted in writing by July 5, 2010. Refunds will not be considered after that date. Any request due to medical circumstances that are supported with appropriate documentation will be reviewed on a case by case basis. All deposits are non-refundable. Your deposit is your reservation for your space and when made GGC-Quebec Council commits financial resources for supplies to provide a quality program. No refunds will be given for campers arriving late, leaving early, or attending only a portion of the program.


