SCREENING

With a new Guiding year starting please remember:

- All District/Unit Helpers require an A7 and a current PRC.
- All Camp helpers need an A7 (marked "Camp Only") and a current PRC
- All Treasurers require a current PRC.

Commissioners will receive an email list of the non-members in their District and who have an A7 and a PRC in the near future.

Also be aware that Potential Members (PMBR) must have a PRC done as soon as possible. They are only allowed to be in a Unit **on a regular basis** if they have a PRC.

Police Record Check Renewals – please do these as soon as you receive a letter informing you that your PRC is expiring.

Commissioners will receive an email list of those PRC's expiring between Sept 1, 2010 and Aug 31, 2011. These can be done anytime, the sooner the better.

Membership Cards will start going out to the Districts in the next few weeks. They will go out monthly. If there are any mistakes – name, unit etc please let me know and I will see that it is corrected and a new card issued

Unit rosters should be checked often so that new girls (INQ's) may be contacted.

All girls/parents need to know when meetings are starting.

Treasurers' Trove

For Unit and District Treasurers

Registration:

Parents are expected to pay province directly, and may make arrangements to pay by two instalments using a credit card or cheque with the staff at the Provincial Office. If they wish to pay cash, you need to deposit it in the district or unit account, but please remember to pass it on to the Office as soon as possible. Note that parent cheques should be made out for \$105.00 to GGC Quebec Council. In past we have received a few variations which were unacceptable to the bank, and that led to hassles which were time consuming and totally unnecessary. It will only take Unit Guiders a few seconds to check as they receive the forms, when it is easy to correct.

Ask parents to put the girl's name on the memo line, particularly in cases where her family name is not the same as that of the person signing the cheque.

Please make sure that you forward any payment cheques *with* your registration forms to the Provincial Office as early in the fall as possible. Send in several batches if necessary.

Remember that the girl is not officially registered until the Council Office has received *both* payment and the A5 registration form and her information has been entered in iMIS.

Training:

It is time to think about trainings for the fall. Many Unit Treasurers and several District ones could benefit from attending a Financial Training. If there are several people in your District who are interested, let me know and we can arrange a date. If you are alone, let me know and I'll tell you if there are any other trainings around which you might be able to attend. I don't mind coming to small groups.

The training takes about 3 ½ hours or a bit longer if people have lots of questions. We will cover all you need to know to keep your books to the standard required by National, including mid-year and year-end reporting and budgeting.

Signing Officers:

It is time once again to change or re-affirm your signing officers on your bank accounts. This must be done every year at a District meeting, followed by visits to the banks involved.

Many signing officers will be changing this year as several districts are merging. Remember that Joanne Millette and Susan Welsh are to be the Provincial designates on all District level accounts. The District Commissioner and District Treasurer should be on all District and Unit accounts. Remember that there must be at least four signing officers on each account.

For units and districts, the procedure is the same as last year. Check the Unit and District Treasurer handbooks for the details and sample wording for motions. (They are posted on the GGC Quebec web site at: http://www.guidesquebec.ca/GGSite/paperworks.aspx with the Financial Forms).

Cookies:

The Chocoatey Mint Cookies should be delivered in mid September. Remember that there is a blackout on other fundraising for one month after cookies are delivered to allow the girls to concentrate on selling at least two cases of cookies each.

Safe Guide July 2010 Update <u>recommends</u> an **Emergency First Aid** Certification for <u>Green Level</u> and <u>most Yellow Level</u> Activities.

An **Emergency First Aid** Certification (or having a health care professional present) is <u>required</u> for <u>Yellow Level Activities that include the following:</u>

- EMS response 30 min up to 1 hour
- Activity lasting more than 8 hours
- Camp stove or campfire cooking
- Transportation arranged by Unit
- Specialized equipment
- Sleepover or camping

The ratio of required First Aiders and/or health care professionals to girl participants is 1:25.

At least one **Standard First Aid** Certification (or health care professional) is <u>required</u> for <u>all Red Level</u> Activities. When EMS response time is more than 4 hours, at least one **Wilderness First Aid** Certification is required. The ratio of required First Aiders and/or health care professionasl to all participants (adults and girls) is 1:25 for Red Level Activities.

A **first aid kit** appropriate for the activity and environment must be on-hand for all activities, including regular Unit meetings. The kit should contain, as a minimum, bandages to stop bleeding, a one-way valve facemask or shield and protective gloves.

Complete details for Activity Levels and First Aid Requirements are found in the Safe Guide document, July 2010 update, found on the Girl Guides of Canada website.

NOW IS THE TIME to check whether you, or any of the Guiders in your District, need to complete or renew a first aid certification during this Guiding year.

Let us know your personal/District needs, renewal deadlines, and availability as soon as possible so that we can provide the right course at the best time for you. Remember that we will come to your District when it suits you best when you have 10 or more who need to take the same course.



SAFE GUIDE TRAININGS

Safe Guide Tips from your Assessor Team.

Safe Guide 2010 Amendments to the Safe Guide (2008) came into effect on September 1st. **All** activities must be planned in consideration of these amendments. They are posted in the Memberzone on the Safe Guide page, along with updated forms (eq SG3 and SG8)

Here are a few key points to remember:

- Start planning your activity using the Activity Planners found in Safe Guide. If your activity does not
 exactly match one of the Activity Guides, use the closest match as a guideline. Following the planner
 will help you ensure that you have thoroughly planned your activity and that when you do submit your
 forms for assessment, the assessment process goes quickly and smoothly.
 - A. The Responsible Guider assumes the responsibility for planning and ensuring the safety and well-being of all the participants. It is her responsibility to ensure compliance to Safe Guide. The assessor will communicate directly with the RG should she require further information or to provide final notification/approval.
 - B. The Activity Guides included in the Safe Guide empower any Guider, regardless of prior experience to plan and support girl engaged activities.
 - C. Completion of the SG forms is the last step in the planning process and flows easily from the use of the Activity Guides.

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- If your travel activity involves fundraising beyond the sale of Girl Guide cookies, you must get Safe Guide <u>pre</u>-approval – through the submission of your SG8. Once approved, you will attach your approved SG8 to your request for fundraising approval (the FR1) when you send it to Council.
- 3. Make sure you are using the up to date SG3. There are several changes to the form (most making it easier for you the Responsible Guider). Destroy copies of the old form saved on your computer. The assessment cannot be done using an outdated form.
- 4. Safe Guide forms MUST be submitted by the deadlines outlined in Safe Guide (as a general rule of thumb: a minimum of 14 days for YELLOW activities and a minimum of 21 for RED). Be aware that any assessment requests that do not come in within this time frame may result in being requested to either revise your activity to a GREEN level one or cancel it. Remember an assessor may be dealing with multiple requests at any one time.
- 5. Looking for help planning your activity or filling out your forms? Talk to your DC, your Camping Adviser, the International Adviser or an experienced Guider.
 - A. Assessors cannot coach you on filling out your forms (think of it this way, they cannot be both your driving instructor and do your driving exam).
 - B. The assessor's **only** role is to provide an independent review of a proposed activity and to evaluate whether it is appropriate for the group. The forms sent to the assessor are to help her understand the nature of the activity before she issues GGC notification or approval.
 - C. The assessor cannot be a resource person for completing the forms as her independence will be lost if she participates in the planning (or provides guidance to the RG during of the preparation of the forms or in the review).
- 6. Ensure that all of the supervisor qualifications (eg First Aid, swim tests, PRCs, Safe Guide training, activity facilitator qualifications, completed A7 forms for non-members and Home Contacts) are sent to the provincial office for entry into iMIS before you submit your SG3 for assessment. The first step in the assessment process is the verification of the adults in iMIS.
- 7. Ensure that a list of all male attendees (including resource people) is attached to your SG3.


Camp Wa-Thik-Ane Update

Well another summer has come and gone and this summer brought many changes to Wa-Thik-Ane. As most of you know, Lori has moved on to take advantage of a great opportunity and we wish her all the best. With Lori leaving and on the heels of major budget cuts we were not able to staff the camp this summer nor were we able to run

our summer camp program. We did hold a very well attended Provincial camp week at the end of July with approximately 65 girls of all ages taking part in various programs. We are not sure what next summer will bring but we will work hard to try and revitalize the use of this beautiful location. In the August Piccolo we advertised for Guiders to join the Wa-Thik-Ane "Property Committee" as this will go a long way in ensuring that the camp is well looked after. We have not had a very good response to this request but I know that there are people out there willing to help out so please contact me!

As a result of not having staff at camp this summer we have had to change some of our practices and policies. We don't want to discourage Guiders from <u>booking</u> the camp, that is still a viable option however the practice of "dropping in" to take advantage of the lake for a paddle or a swim can no longer continue. We are responsible for whatever happens on the property regardless of who is there at the time. In order to accommodate visitors we must have staff on site, either paid or volunteer. This summer, although we pleaded with Guiders to help out and spend a beautiful weekend at camp as the Site Guider, we had little to no response. As a result, anyone showing up at camp without Council approval, or a rental agreement, will be asked to leave. If no one is at the property and you just "show-up" you are trespassing. It saddens me to be this harsh however we can't have things both ways, it takes a lot of work to manage a property like Wa-Thik-Ane and with no one stepping forward we have to restrict the use to paying customers. It is my sincere hope that we can turn this around and offer this property the loving care it deserves.


