#### **SCREENING NEWS**

Various changes have been made to the Screening Process and to the Screening forms. You may have been made aware of these changes already, however, they are shown below.

I will be having screening trainings for new District Commissioners, anyone who will be doing screening or anyone interested, These will be in September. I will put dates and places in the September Piccolo.

#### **CHANGES TO SCREENIG PROCESS**

- Orientation to Guiding (OTG) will be discontinued as a training, but will remain part of the screening process.
- OTG will be a PDF document provided to potential Members and will be reviewed in a conversation between the PMBR and their screener/interviewer.

Members will re-attest to the Code of Conduct when they renew their PRCs.

#### **FORM CHANGES**

#### S.1 Screening Checklist

- Specific reference to Code of Conduct and Promise & Law being read and agreed to has been removed. Agreement to the Code is included in the signature on the A.1 form. There is nothing a new Member signs regarding the Promise & Law.
- Orientation to Guiding has been moved up in the order on the checklist
- All other changes are for formatting and consistency

#### S.2 Interview Form

- Step number has been changed to 4 to align with changes to the Screening Module (will be sent under separate cover)
- Question 1 (have you ever been convicted of a child abuse offence) has been moved to the end of the form
- New question added re: Orientation to Guiding
- All other changes are for formatting and consistency

#### **Ex.3 PRC Exemption Application**

A request was made by the Chief Commissioner to change the "renewable" PRC exemption to "temporary", and to change the increment from 5 years to a range of 1-5 years. This would enable us to better monitor temporary exemptions for individual who may leave the country for a couple of years and then return and become involved in Guiding again. If the temporary exemption was requested and set for 2 years, the individual would be flagged for PRC renewal before the 2 year exemption expired (instead of at the current 5 years) following our standard process. The Ex.3 form has been reworded to reflect this change.
