Where do we stand now?

Compared to the 2009-2010 Guiding year we are: - 12% for girls and -15% for adults

Why?

First, many thanks to all the DC's who took time out of their very busy schedules to meet with various members of the Quebec Membership Growth Team (QMGT) to discuss the challenges and opportunities related to membership growth in their District. We learned a great deal.

We learned the following (in summary):

- . Most districts are undertaking activities which bring them visibility in their communities
- 'Girls recruit girls' and 'adults recruit adults'
- . Advertising has not been making the telephones ring to any extent
- . Guiding, if known in the community, is not considered as 'cool', or 'au courant' or relevant by many girls and parents
- . We now have some more traditional communities where Guiding has been absent for enough time that there is no community memory
- Adult recruitment is a challenge everywhere

What is next?

We have a plan!

Very shortly we will be attending the next DC meeting in order to discuss a proposed plan that focuses on the very short term. That is – this spring! This plan can only succeed with the commitment of all! Once we have feedback from the DC's you will be hearing about the plans.

We are also in discussions with National regarding the potential for a pilot project for 2011.

Together we can grow Guiding and 'make a difference in the world'

For the past 85 years Camp Wa-Thik-Ane has been getting its water supply from Lac Bouchette. Well times have changed and we are now required to supply drinking water from a Government approved source, or in this case an artesian well. Camp Wa-Thik-Ane offers service and accommodation to the public and this necessitates obtaining special permits prior to the installation of a well. This project could run as high as \$50K. Many people have asked why we just don't take money from the funds that we have received for the sale of Lac Adair. You might be

unaware that the Province has been running a deficit budget for many years and a good portion of this deficit is a result of running our camps. The Province can not continue working with a deficit budget or we will run out of money.

The good news is, a property committee has been formed and one of their mandates is to move Wa-Thik-Ane towards self sufficiency. Our first priority is to raise the funds necessary to install the well otherwise known as "Water for Wa-Thik-Ane". We have many ideas which will enable everyone to get involved in this project. As a matter of fact, the only way that this will work is if everyone does get involved. Plans are in the works to ask our Pathfinders and Rangers to design a fundraising calendar for the month of April which will bring attention to the importance of water and water conservation and at the same time raise the first funds for the well. Many more ideas are in the works and I suggest that you stay tuned to the Piccolo and website for upcoming ideas and opportunities. Groups or individuals can also get involved by offering volunteer time to camp projects like the clean-up weekend on May 13th to 15th. Details will also be in the Piccolo or you can speak to your District Camping Adviser. Finally you will be able to track the progress of this campaign by checking the amount of water that we collect in our giant fundraising bucket. Whether you contribute a little drop or a whole cascade, every little bit will help us fill the bucket, dig the well and succeed.

Let's all get involved in "Water for Wa-thk-ane".


Become Québec's New Training Adviser!!

The 2011 theme

This year the theme is UN Millennium Development Goal (MDG) 3: girls worldwide say "empowering girls will change our world" and the aim is to raise awareness of the situation for many girls and young women and empower them to take a stand against inequality. In different areas of the world, women do not have the same access to education, work and leadership opportunities as men.

Did you know ...

- Women hold only 19 per cent of the world's parliamentary seats
- Girls are twice as likely to be unable to read as boys
- Women do two thirds of the work in the world, but earn only 10 per cent of the income
- Six out of every ten women experience physical or sexual violence in their lifetime

World Thinking Day (WTD) was first celebrated in 1926 at an International conference in the USA, when attendees decided that there should be a special day when **Girl Scouts and Girl Guides all around the world think of each other and give thanks and appreciation to their 'sister' Girl Guides and Girl Scouts**. In 1932, at another event in Poland, the idea of further showing appreciation and friendship to all girls by offering a voluntary contribution to the World Association was established.

How do we celebrate

Every year girls and young women around the world organize fun activities to celebrate World Thinking Day and to learn more about the theme. These are just some examples of what they did in 2009, which focused on the theme girls worldwide say "Stop the spread of AIDS and other diseases":

- The 22nd Hamilton Spark Unit in Hamilton, Ontario, raised a total of \$112.00 to buy 16 mosquito nets for the 'Malaria Bites' programme through the Canadian Red Cross.
- The Association des Guides Musulmanes du Liban celebrated World Thinking Day 2009 with songs, games and sweets. They visited patients in a hospital to wish them a speed recovery and put a smile on their faces.
- In Santiago, Panama, Guides did some door to door visits in the neighborhood to give information on HIV and AIDS. They also did a survey about the knowledge on HIV and AIDS in the village of La Chorrera.
- Federação de Bandeirantes do Brasil asked their members to participate in an interactive online course about the theme 'Stop the spread of AIDS'. The course is part of the project 'Listen, Learn and Live' about preventing the spread of AIDS and sexual transmitted diseases.
- ASIJ Troop 16 from Tokyo Council of USAGSO participated in a postcard exchange, traded patches
 with troops in other countries and also a couple shoeboxes with things from Japan with troops in Ireland
 and New York.
- A group of Wolves called 'The Joyful group of Winnie The Pooh,' which meets at Primary School nº1 Jaworze (Poland), took part in a Red Cross initiative called "Stop malaria". They watched a multimedia presentation and learned important facts about the disease

Today World Thinking Day raises funds for the Movement worldwide, benefiting millions of girls through the work of the World Association and our Member Organizations. The money raised is used to carry out projects and advocacy campaigns and to support Member Organizations in their work at the grass roots level.

2010 "together we can end extreme poverty and hunger" (MDG1) We have a special focus on the difference Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting can make in five countries: Zimbabwe, Sudan, Maldives, Haiti and Georgia

2011 "empowering girls will change our world" (MDG3)

2012 "we can save our planet" (MDG7)
