Membership Day at Sears



This is a great opportunity to showcase all that Guiding has to offer girls and women in the greater community at a 'can't be missed' location.

Sears Canada has generously extended an invitation again this year for Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada to set up Membership Information tables in Sears, Sears Home and Outlet stores on **Saturday**, **August 20** across Canada, during Sears' "Back to School" event.

Sears Membership Day will help:

- promote Guiding in your community
- provide girls and their parents with information on local units
- showcase local Guiding Units/Branches

 hand out promotional materials directing parents to our new convenient Online Registration System and answer questions about registering girls online

hand out A.1s to women who show interest in volunteering

Membership Day at Sears is not limited to participation by Unit Guiders. A team can be created comprising of adult or Girl Members, Link and Trefoil Guild Members, and/or Commissioners – anyone with sound knowledge of local Guiding activities that can be a great spokesperson for this event.

Unit Guiders who wish to use the event to grow their own Unit may do so. However, through our communications and GGC promotion material they can also provide information on other Branches/ages programming for the girls in their community.

Encourage the participation of Girl Members to give personal endorsements of the Guiding experience. Girl Members requiring 'volunteer hours' can use time spent at this event towards those hours.

How to Sign Up

This year, Districts, Communities or Units wanting to take part in this opportunity at Sears will do so by **registering their participation on-line at the National website**. A registration web form is available through <u>Member Zone -> Membership -> Membership Day at Sears</u>. Participants will provide a key contact name, her iMIS number and complete address, then choose the store location they wish to participate at from a drop down menu, and the length of time they will be in attendance.

Times will be reserved according to the date of registration received. Participants will be contacted by the National office to confirm their participation. If they need to change their time or cancel the event they will do so by e-mailing the contact in their confirmation e-mail. This type of detail will be covered in the confirming e-mail.

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Confirming with Sears

The store will be contacted and the time booked by the National Office and confirmed with the group. Locations and times will be promoted on the National website. Unless a Guider has a long standing relationship with Sears, all stores should be booked centrally by the National Office.

Promotion and Registration Materials

The event has been promoted in the June Guidepost with instructions on how to sign up. An additional reminder will go out in the July Guidepost.

Prior to the event, the Member contact will receive by mail a complete "Guiding in a Box" package, with information on online registration for participating provinces, Girl and Adult registration forms, signs and other promotional material for use at this event.

Promotion to the Public

The event will be promoted on the National GGC website, as well as through PSAs, in-store announcements, and the Sears flyer which is delivered to homes across the country. Visitors to the website will be able to access a map to view participating stores and times.

FAQ

Q. Does every District/Community have to participate in this event?

A. No, this is not a mandatory Membership event but an opportunity to promote Guiding to girls and their families who may not be aware that Guiding is available in their town, community or area.

Q. Can only Unit Guiders attend?

A. No, we hope that Unit Guiders will attend but this is a general Membership/promotional event, not just for a particular unit. Commissioners, Members-at-Large, Advisers, Trefoil Guild Members, Rangers, Links and Girls from other Branches can all assist with this event.

Q. Why is this event so early in August?

A. This is the time parents begin to look for activities for their children and 'back to school' events are on in stores. It is great time to bring Community Guiding to the forefront of girls and their parents. It is also to take advantage of Sears' "Back to School" event.

Q. How many women should be at the table?

A. A minimum of two adults or an adult and youth Member.

Q. Do we have to cover the full day?

A. If you are planning to be at a store you should try to cover at least three hours - but do what your volunteers for the event are able to do.

Q. Can units use Membership Day at Sears to also take registrations for their Unit?

A. For participating provinces, the emphasis should be on promoting the benefits of Guiding and promoting online registration as a fast, easy, convenient way of registering their daughter/ward, with immediate confirmation. For adults and for provinces using paper registration for girls, you can use this as a Unit's registration event.
