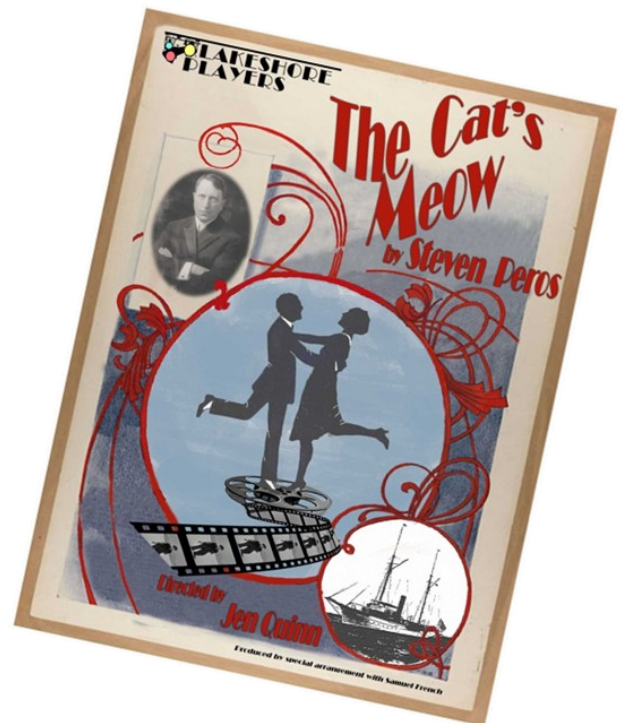

REMINDERS:

- ◆ **It's time to check your First Aid certification expiry date!** Now is the time to find your First Aid Certification Card and check when it expires. All cards should carry an expiration date, and all qualifications should be in iMIS including this date. If your certification will expire before the end of this Guiding year, start planning the time to take a course to update your knowledge and skills. There have been many changes over the past three years! Be aware that there is NO period of grace if you wish to be the First Aider for an upcoming Guiding event. You either have a current certification, or you do not. One day can make a lot of difference to your Unit's plans!
- ◆ All Pulse Aide Inc. courses include the Canadian Red Cross First Aid and CPR/AED Revised Program Standards for 2012, and the new Red Cross Manual. Certification is valid for 3 years from the date of the certification.
- ◆ Details of First Aid requirements for Safe Guide activities are found in the [Safe Guide document](#) in the *Guider Resources* section of the GGC website.
- ◆ Upon completion of a recognized First Aid training, GGC-Québec Council will reimburse 2/3 of the cost for an adult Guider.

Safe Guide, our risk management program, must be completed within six months of becoming a registered Guider. Many new Guiders will need to complete this training by March 2013. So why wait until the last minute? Contact your DC to arrange a training.

DCs: To avoid any panic, book a Safe Guide training for your district NOW. Contact safe-guide@guidesquebec.ca or louise.triggs@rocler.com. Give us two dates to choose from, book a location, and we'll get rolling. It will be advertised in the next *Piccolo*.

Treasurers' Trove

January; a time of quiet recovery after the hectic holidays. The children are back at school, snowflakes drift softly down, and you've got peace and quiet to get your Guiding finances in order before the end of the month! But of course that will only take an hour or two at most if you've kept up to date all year, as I am sure many of you have!

Please make sure you include all supporting documents with your financial books when you give them to your District Treasurer (Units and Trefoil Guilds) or the provincial office (Districts) for review. This is the biggest cause for delays in getting the books back to you, especially as we review the District books.

The deadline for submitting your books for review is January 31. This applies to both Unit and District books.

Remember that you must use independent reviewers (no signing officers, relations or business connections) for the Unit books. Usually this can be done at a book review party of all the Unit Treasurers.

This year, we will have the District Treasurers review each other's books in a similar format as we have had in the past. We will probably meet at the same time as the DCs; sometime in February would suit most people. Those who attend will be able to take their books home with them. Hope to see you all then!

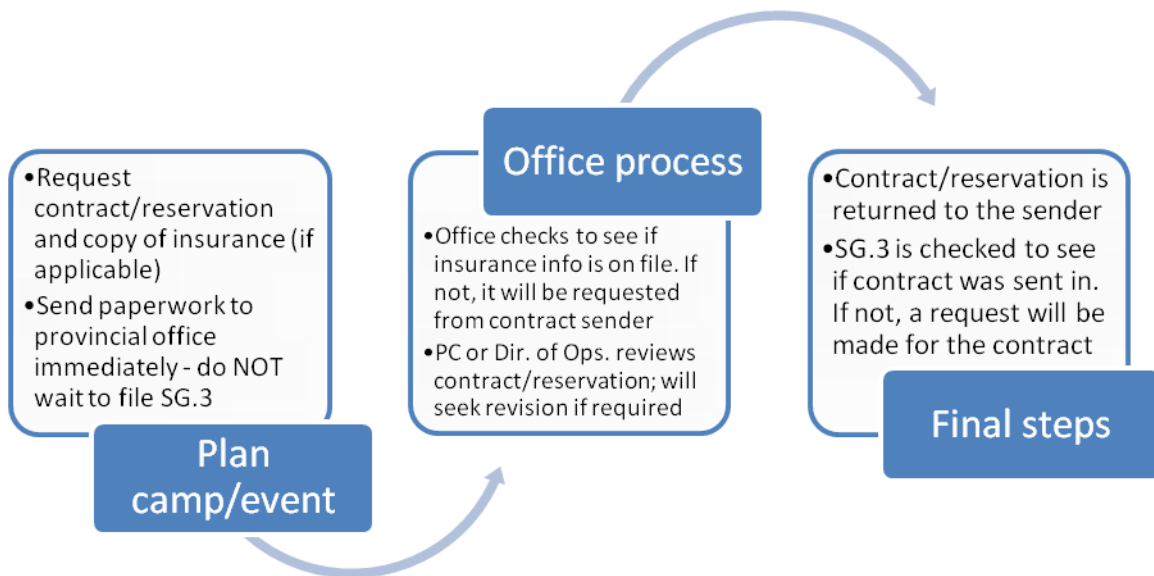

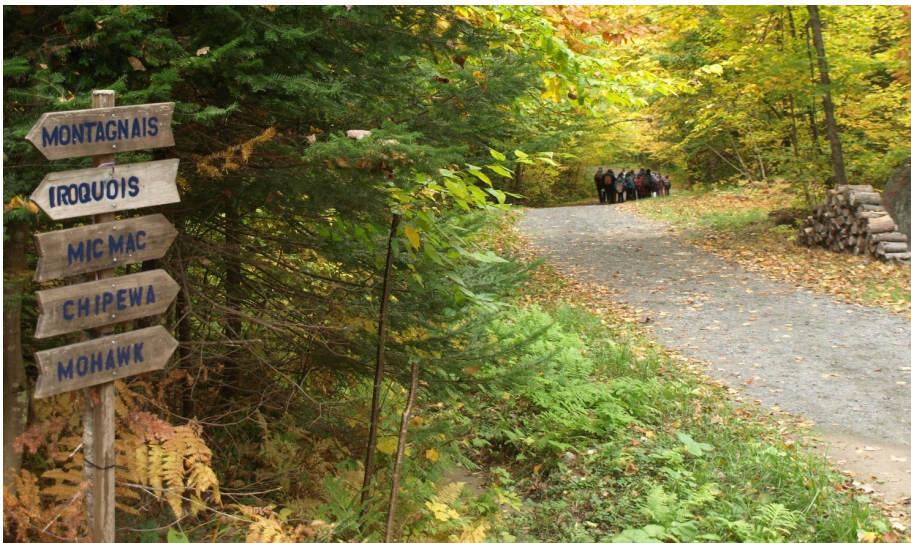
Important Information for Contracts, Agreements, Reservations and Insurance

As a reminder, all contracts (for meeting space, sleepover locations, camp locations, etc.) **must** be signed by the PC or her designate (Director of Operations) - no exceptions. The agreement should include a summary of terms and conditions. Send them as early as possible to programsupport@guidesquebec.ca.

GGC also requires **proof of liability insurance** in order to sign contracts. For facilities or service providers not regularly used by GGC, please request a copy of their general liability insurance (certificate or summary of policy) at the time the contract or rental agreement is negotiated. (The provincial office will then keep a copy for future reference.)
