Keep Calm – Keep on Guiding!



U.S. Girl Scouts to sell cookies online, but Canada's Girl Guides won't follow (CBC News)

Girl Scouts USA have unveiled plans to promote cookie selling online. Mike Sheeler from the GGC national office explained why GGC does not plan to follow that route. "...we do not want to lose the face-to-face interaction between girls and the supporting public." Furthermore, the venture 'would not be economically feasible.'

What's the 'Evolution' game all about? Guider Jenn explains:

All girls start at the first stage (we chose caterpillar -

crawling on the floor). Two caterpillars play one round of "Rock, Paper, Scissors", and whoever wins evolves into the next stage (cocoon - standing, arms wrapped across body). Cocoons can only battle other cocoons, and when they do, the winner becomes a butterfly (flapping arms). We ended the game when everyone was a butterfly. There are variations to this game—e.g. How many evolution stages, which animals chosen, etc.

This group put a twist on the game! To help the girls learn how to make the Girl Guide sign and handshake, they were to shake hands before they battled their new opponent.


Fresh from our GGC Québec blog:

Safe Guide: our risk management program! Safety is the responsibility of all!

IMPORTANT MESSAGE:

When a unit hires a truck and float to put girls on in a parade, it is a Yellow level activity. You will need to check that your driver is licensed and insured for this activity. Let the driver know that GGC has no insurance for their part of the activity; they are responsible for maintaining adequate insurance; any physical damage to the vehicle or liability is the responsibility of the vehicle owner. It is a good idea to ask the driver to provide a certificate of insurance on his vehicle.



When developing your supervision plans as part of managing the activity, consider the age of the

girls who are participating and make appropriate arrangements. It may be a good idea to have a barrier around the edge of the float. It is likely that at the end of the parade it may be crowded with other parade participants so you will need to determine how to keep track of the girls and get them back to their parents.

NEW GUIDERS:

It is compulsory for new Guiders to complete Safe Guide training <u>within the first six months</u> of becoming a leader. For Guiders who cannot attend a face-to-face training, you have the possibility to do it online. You will receive instructions from the provincial office along with a PIN to complete the online (e-Learning) training. Don't forget to **send proof of completion** to imis@guidesquebec.ca. (A certificate will be emailed to you once you've completed the online training.)

Many new Guiders are due to complete their Safe Guide training in the months of January, February, and March 2015. If you would like an in-person Safe Guide training in your district, speak with your DC and start planning!

Year-end

Financial Reviews

There is a **new Financial Review Checklist** this year, with questions about the collection of taxes. It will be up on the Quebec website by the end of December.

Unit books should be reviewed within the district, as long as those doing the review meet the requirements for independent reviewers as outlined in the handbooks. District Treasurers should send the Annual Financial Reports and copies of the Financial Review Checklists for each unit to the provincial office.

District books will be reviewed by the District Treasurers at a book review day this year. Please send all documentation (see list on the Annual Financial Report) to the provincial office <u>by</u> <u>January 31, 2015.</u> We will probably meet in February, at the same time as the DCs, but I'll let you know.

Trefoil Guild books of Guilds with their own bank accounts should also be reviewed at year-end. They should be treated as unit books and be reviewed within the district.
