For those who were unable to attend Symposium 2014, you missed meeting and learning about


Millie – the millennial girl. The millennial girl is who we work with every week.






### Happy World Thinking Day!

# Have you nominated a fellow Guider or Girl Member for an award lately?

Here's how to proceed:

- \* Request an iMIS Profile for the person you are nominating (<a href="mailto:imis@quidesquebec.ca">imis@quidesquebec.ca</a>).
- Complete the R.3P form available <u>HERE</u>, on the Forms page of the national website.
- Obtain the necessary letter(s) of recommendation. Attach the letters and the profile to the R.3P form.
- Forward these to your District Commissioner or to the Awards Team (awards.reconnaissance@guidesquebec.ca) for approval.
- Each member of the district or Awards Team votes to approve or not approve the award (must have a majority vote). This can be done at a meeting, by telephone poll or by e-mail vote.
- If approved, the signature of the District Commissioner is required along with the <u>name of the council</u> (e.g. Riverview District, Camping Committee, Québec Council)
- Send the R.3P to the provincial office for input into iMIS (imis@guidesquebec.ca). Purchase the award.
- If the presentation date on the form differs from the actual presentation date, it is the responsibility of the Guider who signed the R.3P form to advise the provincial office of the change.
- Upon presentation of the award, the recipient can be given the letters of recommendation.
- The iMIS profile must be destroyed.
- For Adult Awards, letters of recommendation must contain the following "buzz" words:

Québec Award – Distinctive / Medal of Merit – Exceptional
Gold – Outstanding / Silver – Excellent / Bronze – Dedicated / Thanks – Good

- For additional awards, consult the **Awards** page under **Unit Support Resources** in Member Zone

- \* National Scholarship application is due April 1, 2014

The dates for our online registration system are now set:

Registration Dates	Who can register
April 1 - April 30	Girls returning to their units
May 1 - June 1	Any girl returning to her unit or switching units or branches
June 2 onwards	All girls

Note the system will be **shut down for maintenance from March 3 until March 31.** During this time, girls can register using the paper process.

Safety is the responsibility of all!

#### **NEW GUIDERS:**

It is compulsory for new Guiders to complete the **Safe Guide training** within the first six months of becoming a leader.

**Guiders who joined in September and October 2013** are nearing the end of these six months. If you haven't yet completed the training, please contact your DC ASAP to give her dates of your availability as a session may be planned in your district. Find out when you are due!

Guiders who cannot attend a face to face training have the possibility to do it **online**. Contact the provincial office (admin@guidesquebec.ca) for instructions and a PIN.

For **YELLOW** assessments, it is <u>compulsory</u> to provide an **SG.1 with a schedule of activities**, **SG.3**, **SG.4** and **SG.5** (if applicable). Forms must be sent to <u>sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca</u> 14 days in advance of your activity.

Also, it would be appreciated if all forms are sent together and the Responsible Guider (RG) indicates **iMIS numbers** for all adults participating in the activity.



**TRAVEL—72 hours or more:** The SG.8 with the proposed itinerary, planning timeline and proposed budget must be sent to sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca before any activities or fundraising take place. Upon receiving approval of the trip, the RG must send the SG.8 and FR.1 to finances-support@guidesquebec.ca to be approved. For guidance, please contact your DC, Safe Guide Adviser or International Adviser.

**Are you First Aid certified?** These trainings by **Pulse Aide Inc.** are tailored to the needs of GGC as per the latest Safe Guide. They are based on the Canadian Red Cross First Aid and CPR/AED Program Standards for 2013, and include the current Red Cross manual and a Red Cross certification valid for 3 years from the end date of the course. ### **Treasurers' Trove**

For Unit and District Treasurers

#### NEW on the GGC Québec website:

The Cheque Requisition form and the Camp/Event Financial Sheet are now up separately on the Forms page of the provincial website so that Guiders other than the Treasurers can access what they need individually. Don't forget to send your Treasurer a copy!

At this time, we still don't have answers to those pesky questions you have asked about the collection of the GST and QST— which only means that you have asked good questions! So kudos to those of you who came up with them.

#### To charge participants an even amount using the GST/QST calculator:

This is one question that can be clarified, sort of. Several of you have noted that the backwards calculator doesn't always work out evenly.

For example, if you want to charge \$20, the calculator tells you to charge participants \$17.40, GST of \$0.87, QST of \$1.74 which actually totals \$20.01. But if you put in \$17.39 as the participant fee, GST is \$0.87, QST is \$1.73, for a total of \$19.99— which is not what you'd like to charge the parents.

The math is right. Excel rounds the half cents but remembers the fact, which leads to the errors. For those of you mathematically inclined, the problem is not only in the rounding but in the significant figures as well. If someone who "speaks" Excel can help me out with this, please let me know and I'll fix it for next year.

The solution: do some rounding yourself. Keep the higher amount of taxes but lower the participant fee so you charge \$17.39, GST of \$0.87, QST of \$1.74 for a total of \$20.00.

Here's a table to help you out with the most common ones which don't add up properly:

Even amount to charge	GST	QST	Participant Fee
10.00	0.44	0.87	8.69
20.00	0.87	1.74	17.39
30.00	1.30	2.61	26.09
60.00	2.61	5.21	52.18
70.00	3.04	6.07	60.88
100.00	4.35	8.68	86.97
110.00	4.78	9.55	95.67
140.00	6.09	12.15	121.76

Note that all the \$5.00 amounts and the \$10.00 ones not here work, but I didn't check all of those in between. If you have issues, I'm only an e-mail away!

As soon as I get answers to some of the questions you have asked (and will continue to ask, I'm sure) I will put them in *The Piccolo* and then maintain an FAQ sheet with the forms on the website.

If you haven't made it to a transition training yet, please let me know ASAP and I'll try to get another group together.
