What: Camp fun at our provincial camp in Morin Heights, camp skills, games, outdoor cooking

The goal of this event is to encourage new and experienced campers and Guiders to visit the camp and try camping without the concern of the overnight or the required planning and to

give those who love camping another chance to enjoy it before the winter.

When: Saturday, October 3rd, 2015

9:30 am—arrival at Wa-Thik-Ane, Morin Heights

7:30 pm—departure from Wa-Thik-Ane, Morin-Heights

Transportation: Departure approx. 8 am, from location on the registration form; return approx. 9 pm to same

Cost: \$45.00 per person (girls and adults)

Includes 3 snacks, 2 meals, a crest and activities



Safe Guide News

Safe Guide: our risk management program! Safety is the responsibility of all!

The **2015** version of **Safe Guide** is now available on the national Safe Guide web page along with an explanation of changes (6 pages). **All Guiders** should read this document carefully. It will give you the highlights of the different changes with detailed explanations as you will need to refer to the **2015** version of **Safe Guide** when planning activities. **All previous** versions are out of date.

What's new? Here are a few highlights:

- The state of the s
- First Aid training: blended learning courses (on-line courses with an in-person hands-on learning component) are included as an acceptable option
- **Health care professionals** are no longer restricted to volunteering in the province/territory where their professional qualifications are registered.
- **First Aid Organizations**: the list of provincial and territorial "approved organizations" first aid organization is now a guide for to determining whether a first aid course is acceptable allowing for more flexibility in the selection of first aid course providers.
- Incident report: (INS.01) should be sent to your Provincial Office as well as the national office.
- Camping Ratio: must include non-member children.
- **Group Travel in Canada 72 hours**: note that all Guiders must start with the group and remain with the trip for its duration. As well, for pre-authorization your SG.8 must include a list of participants, their iMIS numbers, and for girls their date of birth. Also the steps in fundraising have been clarified.
- Changes in the forms: A.7, <u>SG.3</u>, <u>H.2</u>, IT.1, IT.4, IT.5, IT.11

REMINDERS:

- As of August 2015 all activities must be planned based on the July 2015 version of Safe Guide.
- It is important that Guiders develop their Emergency Response Plan (ERP) related to their activity and make sure that ALL the Guiders in the unit have read it for each specific activity.
- Safe Guide training is required of all **new members** within six months of joining Girl Guides.
- Now is a good time to locate your First Aid certification card and check on the expiry date. You may be due to renew your qualifications
- All Safe Guide forms should be sent to sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca for assessment 14 days in advance.

This year out of respect for the ASSESSORS we will work all together to send our forms on time.


As September approaches, please remember to check your rosters weekly for new and returning girls.
