

Saturday May 7

Weather permitting - we will pitch canvas tents; a minimum of 4 people is needed per tent. We will be cleaning and preparing Algonquin, Iroquois, Cree, Huron, MicMac, Stavert, Health Centre and the Food Services building. To complete these tasks, you will be provided with gloves, brooms and washcloths. Small repairs and maintenance tasks will continue around camp.

Sunday May 8

Finish tent pitching and cleaning and preparing sites. Other jobs may include changing floorboards, stairs, clearing fallen branches and small carpentry jobs. You are welcome to bring your tool belt. A list of issues requiring further maintenance at each site is provided.

Food: We will provide meals on Saturday, May 7th — soup, chili/vegetables, snacks, coffee and tea. Sunday, May 8th —Mcmuffins for breakfast and soup for lunch. Bring your own mug, filled water bottle and any extra food as needed. To help us plan food quantities, please let us know if you are staying over Friday and/or Saturday at

May 9-13

Completion of tent pitching and any small maintenance jobs in small groups (minimum 4) depending on your availability and the weather.

*** Access by car may be limited due to weather conditions and we may not have running water.***

MAY 2-8 IS NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

National has published an excellent <u>instant meeting</u> focusing on activities that will help girls develop techniques for managing stress and anxiety in healthy and positive ways.

The **1st Mount Bruno Pathfinders** tried it out and here's what they had to say:

It went super well. I highly recommend. The girls appreciated it and we realized just how much they need time to talk, share their worries and to learn how to deal with stress. We made the worry wall, made stress balls, discovered healthy breathing, learned about mindfulness, colored mandalas, did a 10-minute "Headspace" meditation session and sent each girl home with a brand new gratitude journal to fill in to help them focus on the good things in their lives. — Ingrid Hamel

Event Subsidy

Planing a recruitment event, or Bring-A-Friend evening? Your district may be eligible for the new GGC-QC **Event Subsidy**! As part of the 2016 Spring Registration campaign and beyond, GGC-QC is reimbursing districts for costs associated with recruitment or public awareness events.

Costs such as:

- venue or booth rental fee
- local advertisitng (if a cost is attached)
- activity materials
- booth supplies
- Bring-A-Friend activities
- others on a case by case basis, may be eligible for reimbursement



Safe Guide News

Congratulations to all Guiders who have completed **SAFE** on how to proceed. GUIDE TRAINING in the last two months. Reminder for the others: April and May are months where many Guiders are due for Safe Guide training.

For face-to-face training contact your DC to give her the dates of your availability if you want a Safe Guide training session in your district.

Online training is available for Guiders who cannot attend a face-to-face training session. Contact the provincial office (admin@guidesquebec.ca) for a PIN and the instructions

Please make sure that your completed Safe Guide evaluation is sent to the provincial office at imis@guidesquebec.ca.

It is a tricky situation because you are a full member of GGC but with an overdue Safe Guide training you are not fully equipped to manage the safety of the girls. It is the main reason why GGC has installed the compulsory training to make sure that all the Guiders and the girls are well protected by GGC.

Treasurers' Trove

The Skinny on Cookies

Our cookies are our major fundraiser, and are exempt from taxes. So we don't charge or pay taxes on them. Yay!

When you pay for cookies, \$48.45 per case goes to Québec Council. The national portion (including what national pays Dare) of that is \$26.50 per case, Québec Council keeps \$21.95, and you get to keep \$11.55 between the unit and district.



Don't forget to account for cookies you give away or use in the unit or district...these cookies cost you \$4.04 a box. under whichever expenses column is appropriate on the spreadsheet on the same line as you enter your payment for them.



For those who have Special Order (or Travel Cookies), you will pay \$39.00 per case to Québec Council. The national portion stays the same at \$26.50 but Québec Council has dropped their portion to \$11.50, allowing the group travelling to keep \$21.00 per case towards your trip. These cookies are only available to groups travelling: your SG8 must be approved before you are allowed to order them, and the girls must sell 2 cases per campaign at the regular price for the unit. When your District Cookie Advisor orders the cookies, it must be clearly indicated that

they are for the group travelling. If you want more information about these cookies, contact the office or financessupport@guidesquebec.ca.

Remember that we are not to run other fundraisers for one month after we receive the cookies, so this year from the middle of April until the middle of May, unless you have special permission. This is to take advantage of our large scale advertising and to allow the girls to concentrate on the best fundraising opportunity we have: 64% of sales remain in Guiding. I don't know of any better fundraiser out there!
