Cookies are Coming!!!!!

March 13-18, cookies will be delivered to districts. Now is the time to start preparing your girls and, if you haven't already done so plan our cookie selling events.

Cookie All Stars opened on February 5 for both Mint 2018 and Classic 2019. It closes on May 1.

Cookie days in Canada will be April 6 and 7. You don't need to sell cookies at a partner location. Door-to-door and blitzes at other places also count for the crest (but only if you sign up). Don't forget to add your event to the Cookie Finder Map

"Cookie Recipes for Girl Greatness" Notecards: Use these <u>notecards</u> to give to customers so they can download the Cookie Recipes for Girl Greatness. You can also get printed copies of the recipe book from the provincial office.

Book Reviews

Thanks to all district treasurers who have sent in their reviewed books or participated in the book swap in late February. Your help in getting the books reviewed is greatly appreciated!

For those district treasurers who have not done so, note that the books should have been sent to the office by now for review. If your books were reviewed by another party, please forward the signed Annual Financial Report (AFR), the signed Financial Review Checklist (FRC) and a copy of the bank statement showing the Dec 31 balances.

The unit and trefoil guild books should have been reviewed and the AFRs, FRCs and bank statement copies should also have been sent to the office.

Keep in mind that the office does not need copies of the spreadsheets, just the AFRs and the FRCs. However, you must keep <u>all</u> documentation (including receipts or copies of the receipts if the originals were sent in for taxation purposes as well as copies of the spreadsheets etc.) for 7 years in order to comply with the document retention policy.

CWFF money is due soon as well. A cheque should be sent to the office that is at least equivalent to all money collected. Keep in mind that the suggested minimum is \$1 per girl.

Cookies

The classic cookies will also be delivered shortly! Remember there is a blackout on other fundraising for one month after the cookies arrive. This allows our girls to concentrate on the best fundraiser available to us. There are also many resources available in the <u>cookie section of the provincial website</u> to assist with cookie tracking and inventories.

As a reminder, cookies given away or used in the unit/district are more complicated because you have bought these cookies, but have no proceeds for them. In order to balance overall, a cost must be associated with them and recorded in the spreadsheet:

- When 1 box of cookies is eaten at camp, these should be recorded in the Camp column in the expense section.
- Since the cases are currently bought for \$48.45, each box used or given away costs \$4.04 (\$48.45/12 boxes)

If a box is given as a "thank you" for a guest, or a gift it should be in the appropriate column.

When paying the supporting council for the cases you bought (see earlier paragraph) you would split out the total between cookies sold and cookies used:

Any Girl Guide merchandise produced, whether you're planning to sell it or not, needs to be approved at the provincial office. Simply send your design to qc-communications@guidescanada.ca and you should hear back in 1-2 days. You can also check out the Merchandise Standards on Member Zone to make sure you're using the allowed fonts, colours, etc.

DEAR OLAVE: I've never filled out Safe Guide forms before and it looks like it's going to be my turn for spring camp this year. I did the Safe Guide training but I'm a little worried. Is there any advice you can give me?

Paperwork Troubled

DEAR PAPERWORK: That's exciting! Remember that even if you're the responsible Guider, you can always ask for help. Maybe there's a more

experienced Guider in your district who would be willing to sit down with you while you fill out the forms, or take a look at them before you're done. If you have questions, the Safe Guide document is a great resource. You can always email our provincial Safe Guide Adviser at qc-safeguide@guidescanada.ca with questions. Remember to assign a person to every task in your Emergency Response Plan (a commonly forgotten element) and to email your forms to qc-sg-gs@guidescanada.ca when you're all done. Good luck!
