There was recently an amendment to the Quebec Highway Code requiring the use of booster seats for children under 145 cm or 9 years old. If booster seats are not used, this could result in a fine for the driver. All parents and drivers should be aware of this when car-pooling.



Reminders

Some reminders as we go into the busy end of the year:

- Please ensure your paperwork is submitted in a timely manner. Assessors are busy volunteers too and need time to look things over and deal with clarifications and errors. If your activity is out of the ordinary, please allow some extra time.
- If you do not get an automatic response from qc-sg-gs@guidescanada.ca when you submit your paperwork, you either sent it to the incorrect email address, or did not send it.
- If you do not hear from your Assessor within a couple of days, check your junk mail and/or contact qc-sg_gguidescanada.ca to follow up. It is up to the Responsible Guider to follow up. You know you have planned the activity and sometimes things get into junk mail or your Assessor has not followed up. You MAY NOT proceed with a Yellow or Red level activity that has not been assessed. This is for the protection of the girls and the Guiders. Girl Guides of Canada may not cover you if anything happens at an activity which was not approved.

Safeguide Paperwork for the 2018-2019 Guiding Year

This is a reminder that your Safe Guide paperwork for all Unit activities should be placed in an envelope, with the year 2018-2019 on it. The paperwork for each event (SG.1, SG.2, SG.3, SG.4 and any other documents) should be clipped together. They must be kept for 3 years. Check with your District Commissioner for your District's storage plan.


