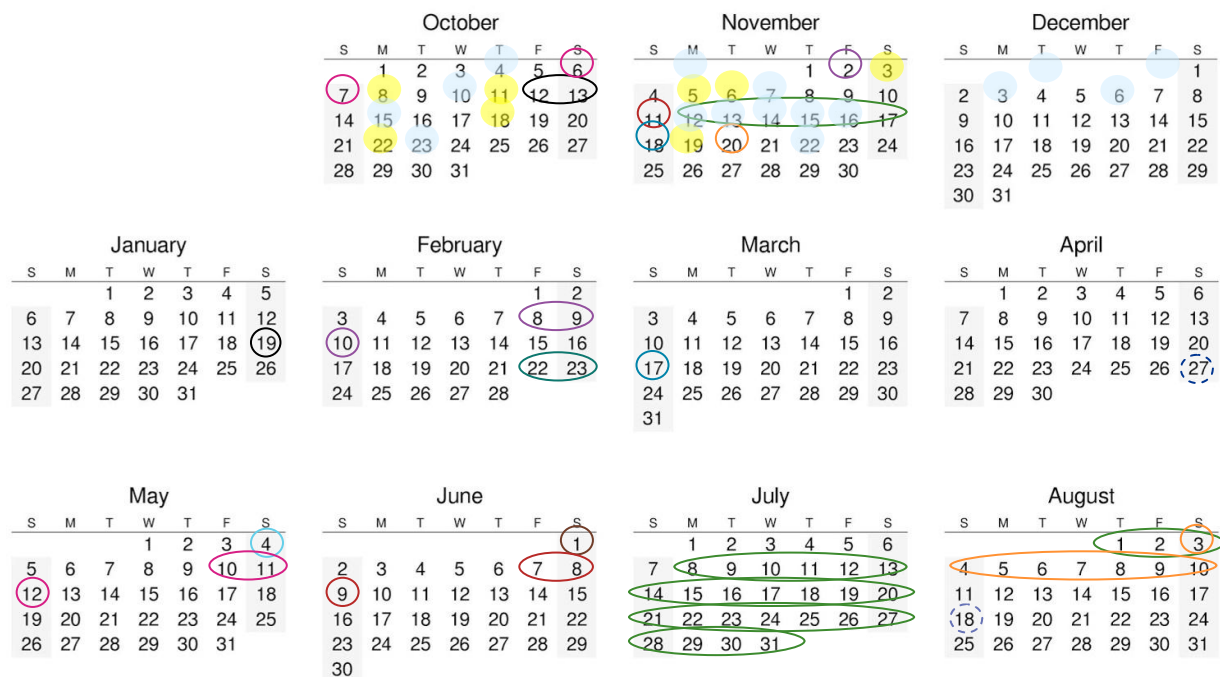

Change up your Halloween Plans!

Change it up this fall and add a little spooky STEM to your Halloween meeting instead of the usual Halloween crafts. Keep things open ended by giving the girls the ingredients and letting them experiment to find what works best on their own.

Ghost Pumpkins: Instead of regular orange pumpkins, try a little chemistry with some “ghost” pumpkins. Let girls experiment with vinegar, baking soda and blue food coloring in a carved white pumpkin.

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DEAR OLAVE,

DEAR OLAVE: A family in my unit is refusing to take cookies to sell. I have ordered two per girl and now I feel like I'm going to be stuck selling hers. Aren't cookie sales a mandatory part of the Guiding experience?

Stuck with Cookies

DEAR STUCK: Cookie selling is indeed a part of the Guiding experience but there are many ways a girl can be involved. You can start by explaining the many benefits of cookie selling to the family (interpersonal skills, money management, goal setting, teamwork, confidence, safety awareness, etc.), but if they're still unwilling, why not invite her to participate in a group selling event. Maybe she can help make posters or a giant cookie sales thermometer. There are many reasons a family might not be keen to take cookies (allergies, not knowing people in the city, etc.) and it's important to respect that. If none of this works, you don't have to be stuck with the cookies. Why not tell all your girls about the exciting Cookie All Star prizes and Cookie Ribbons they can earn and invite one of them to take an extra case.

DEAR OLAVE: My unit would like to start a

Facebook page to show off all the neat activities we do. What are the rules/guidelines around doing this?

Facebook Curious

DEAR FACEBOOK: There are two directions you can go on Facebook. A closed group can be used to share information with parents, whereas an open page can be used to showcase your unit activities. In your case, it sounds like an open page would be your best bet. In most cases you can use your judgement to determine what's okay to post, but remember that with an open page, anyone can see the content. It's a good idea to refrain from posting too many details about events prior to them unless you're inviting the public. For example, you don't necessarily want a stranger showing up at a unit sleepover. In terms of picture sharing, you'll need IR.1s for all the members. Remember that names shouldn't be used with the pictures. Lizzie (Elizabeth Knowles on Facebook) needs to be added as an administrator on all groups and pages.

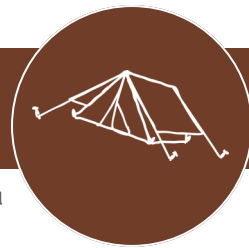

The Safe Guide Forms are updated every year in July and are effective September 1. Please make sure you are using the most current version of your forms as the most common ones were updated this year.

A reminder that all **new Guiders** have **6 months** to complete Safe Guide training. You should have received an e-mail from the Provincial office with the instructions. If you have misplaced them, please contact the office.

In keeping with the Piccolo theme of “change it up,” try having another Guider be the Responsible Guider for your activity that requires paperwork:

- For a Green activity, have her prepare the SG.1 and SG.2 for the parents, as well as any changes to your unit Emergency Response Plan (SG.4)
- For a Yellow activity, such as a sleepover, have her be the Responsible Guider, prepare the SG.1, 2, 3 and 4 and submit to sg.gs@guidesquebec.ca. The usual “paperwork queen” can help her with the process.

Joining Link

What is Link? A Link member can be any young woman in Guiding aged 18 to 35. Link is an open forum for young women to have a place to get together in a relaxed and informal setting. It's a place for those who are unable to commit to a unit or for those who are looking to be a part of Guiding outside of being a Unit Guider.

Link members can have the opportunity to work on brainstorming ideas for their unit meetings, can begin or continue work on a service project, or can just be there to socialize and discuss all aspects of Guiding.

Some Link events or activities may include pub nights, travel, skiing, ice skating, rock climbing, hiking, camping, horseback riding, white water rafting... and anything else you can think of!

What is the time commitment? Whatever amount of time that you can commit to being a Link member. You don't have to participate in all the events, or be at all the meetings.

Budgeting

All districts should begin preparing a budget for the 2019 calendar year.

To facilitate the budgeting process, a tab in the GGC QC Financial Package called *Report and Budget* is available for your use:

- The tab is populated from the current year revenues and expenses, which can be used as a basis for next year's budget.
- In addition to the current year transactions, consider any new events or activities which should be included in budget. For instance, are you planning a new district event, or going to get a bus for camp when you haven't in the past? Have you lost or gained a lot of members?
- Also consider any new fundraising initiatives and whether you plan to order additional cookies etc.

Keep in mind that the budget is just an estimate – it may not be possible to stick to it, but having one is helpful so you can keep it in mind while planning events.

Once prepared and finalized, the budget should be approved through a motion at a district meeting. A copy should be sent attached to the district minutes to finances-support@guidesquebec.ca sometime in October or November.

- Cookies you buy from your supporting council
- Cookies you sell

Cookies given away or used in the unit

The cookies you buy from your support council are straightforward. This is the amount of cookies you have ordered from Province (if you are a district), and an invoice will be sent to the Treasurer and DCs. The total amount of this invoice should be recorded in the Fall or Spring Cookies columns in the expense section of the spreadsheet if no cookies have been used or given away.

Similarly, proceeds from the cookies you sell are recorded in the Fall or Spring Cookies columns in the revenue section of the spreadsheet.

Cookies given away or used in the unit/district are more complicated because you have bought these cookies, but have no proceeds for them. In order to balance overall, a cost must be associated with them and recorded in the spreadsheet:

- When 1 box of cookies is eaten at camp, these should be recorded in the Camp column in the expense section.
- Since the cases are currently bought for \$48.45, each box used or given away costs \$4.04 (\$48.45/12 boxes)

If a box is given as a “thank you” for a guest, or a gift it should be in the appropriate column.

When paying the supporting council for the cases you bought (see earlier paragraph) you would split out the total between cookies sold and cookies used:

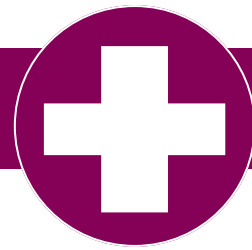
If you have ordered Special Order Cookies, the cost is \$39.00. These are only available if fundraising and other forms have been approved. Should the trip be cancelled, the cookies revert to regular cookies at the prices listed above.

Accounting for Cookies

With the cookie campaign in full stride, it's important to track them properly. Cookie tracking forms are available in the Cookie Resource section of the Guides-Québec website.

There are several elements to keep in mind:

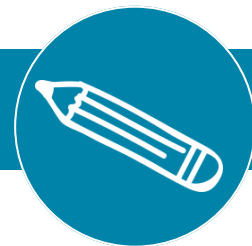
