The National Office will provide additional information that might better explain the increase shortly. I will gladly share some of that information once it is shared with me. What I do know is that SK GGC increased by 210 girls. That is a huge increase. We also increased our Ranger members. That is superb! I think it is important for us all to know where we increased, why we increased and how to keep the momentum going. I know that the success of GGC is due to passionate GGC adult members providing wonderful programming for girls in their communities. Thank you for being our best promoters of GGC. If the girls get what they want out of the program, they “share and tell their friends!” and the excitement snow balls.

I hope that as we roll out the new Girls First program more girls will identify with the program. I am 110% confident that as girls recognize their voice and choice, they will not only remain in GGC for a long time but will share that feeling with other girls in their communities. This will not only increase our membership, but more importantly, increase the impact of girls on their communities in Saskatchewan. A win-win for everyone!

GIRLS FIRST



As we embark on our new program journey, Guiders are strongly advised to review two essential program components of Girls First to prepare them for success:

1. All About Girls First: explore the program structure and guidelines; learn how badging works; and understand why GGC developed a new girl program

2. Girl-Driven Approach: practical tips on how to give each girl choice, voice and action in defining what she wants to get out of her Guiding experience

To review these program components, Guiders have options! Girls First Champions can cover each of these topics informally (e.g., at a coffee shop or on a phone call) or more formally at a Girls First session. Alternatively, Guiders can access two e-modules. These online sessions are free and flexible and contain helpful handouts for reference afterwards. Both in-person and online formats offer Guiders the option of receiving iMIS credit.

Sing Into Spring With the Arts

Earth Day is celebrated annually on April 22. It calls for environmental awareness to protect our Earth. One of the Guiding Laws is to protect our common environment. Get outside for part of a meeting to enjoy nature "singing" to you.

Sing: "Listen to the Earth" in *Celebrate With Song* page 54 (can be sung as a 4 part round). Sing "The First Tulip" in *Sing A Song With Sparks and Brownies* page 26 or Google *Sue's Virtual Campfire Songbook* for words and tunes.

Craft: Guiding Family Tree: Hand out 8.5" X 11" white paper with pre-drawn tree trunk with bare branches. Girls dip thumb into ink pad and press onto branch for one leaf. They print their first name under leaf with fine tipped black marker. Each girl does thumbprint and name. Each girl takes one home in a frame bought from Dollar Store or they buy own frame.
