
- P-cards for Unit Guiders (Quicker access to funds, less prohibitive for units purchasing supplies means better and more consistent experiences for the youth members!).
- LESS work for Guiders, Treasurers, and District Commissioners (which means more time to spend with the youth members!).
- Computerized, will eliminate a lot of paper (more environmentally friendly!).
- Ability to do Unit to Unit and Unit to District transfers (Yay, less work!).

- Less risk to the organization as a whole.
- One budget model for the organization (excluding units).
- Cost savings on audits, as only one audit for the organization will be required.

Saskatchewan Council is also looking at ways to remove the barriers for members so we can provide more opportunities for our members to travel, camp, and enjoy bridging events at the provincial level. We are also working with National to provide some new and unique opportunities for our members, more details to follow!

Please reach out if you have any ideas or if you're looking for an opportunity within Guiding – we have lots of Units looking for Guiders and still have opportunities at the District, Area, and Provincial level as well! Looking forward to a very exciting 2019-2020 as we fully implement the Girls First program and continue moving ahead with GGC's vision of a better world by girls. Thank-you for investing your valuable time in training, planning, and mentoring – and all you do for Guiding in Saskatchewan; you are appreciated!

DAWN 2019

The summer of 2019 brought some fun and adventure to a small group of Girl Guides from Saskatchewan. Applying and being selected to participate in the Provincially Funded trip to Newfoundland was the first step – then the fun began!

Four Pathfinder-aged girls and their Guider traveled across Canada by plane from Saskatoon to Deer Lake, Newfoundland to attend DAWN 2019 which ran from July 29 to August 4, 2019.

DAWN is an Inter-provincial Camp which brought over 340 Guides, Pathfinders, Rangers and Guiders from across Canada. DAWN stands for Discover. Adventure. Wonder. Nature. It was held in the beautiful Gros Morne National Park on the west coast of Newfoundland. It is a true basic camping experience, with campers sleeping in tents and preparing our meals with our patrol.

Campership Fund

Purpose of fund: This fund was established from 20% of the proceeds from Camp Can-ta-ka-ye in 2016 to encourage camping experiences for all girl branch levels in Saskatchewan.

Funds Available: This fund will provide up to 50% of ground fees, usage fees or other related fees, up to a maximum of \$15/night/participant, associated with taking a unit or individual girl to a programmed camp experience. (Camping experience is defined as tenting or residential; two nights or more). Maximum Yearly Allocation of funds available - \$10,000/year

Who may apply: Funds can be requested by Guider after the completion of camp on behalf of attending girl/adult members.

The Outstanding Youth Award recognizes and celebrates the accomplishments of Rangers and Pathfinders who exemplify their dedication to Guiding and their community. The Outstanding Youth Award is presented based on the following criteria:

- The nominee is a registered member of Girl Guides of Canada, Saskatchewan Council, at the Ranger or Pathfinder level
- Displays exceptional leadership qualities within Guiding and in her community at large; enthusiastically brings her personal talents and skills to Guiding
- Has demonstrated qualities of dedicated service to Guiding and her community
- Lives by the ideals of the Guiding Promise and Law; is a positive role model with and out of Guiding; actively promotes Guiding and its benefits
- Is well respected by her peers, Guiders and other members of the community
- Has contributed significantly and has had a positive impact to her unit and community

The award requires one letter of support and completion of the R.3 (select Provincial Award)

Youth Commitment Award

Presented to third year Rangers who have been a member in all branches from Sparks through to Rangers in recognition and celebration of their long-term commitment to Guiding

To qualify members must have:

- one or two years of Sparks
- two years of Brownies
- three years of Guides
- three years of Pathfinders
- three years of Rangers

The list of Rangers eligible for the Youth Commitment Award will be generated from the iMIS records. Certificates are presented at the Youth Recognition awards. No application is necessary.

THE COUNTDOWN IS ON!

Only a few short days until my favourite time of year; you guessed it... COOKIE DAYS! And three times the fun this year?!? WOW! I hope you and your units are geared up with fun and exciting cookie stands, or other accessories to highlight Girl Guides in your communities. Please send those pictures to sk-provincial@girlguides.ca .

I recently attended the Strategic Planning meetings in Saskatoon and I got a lot of "fan-tabulous" ideas I wanted to share with all of you.

10 Ways to Move More Cookies:

1. Have a plan in place before the day of your event: Safe Guide forms, commitment from girls, and a back up location. Or, better still, piggy back a home base and a door-to-door sales in one! Be prepared for the potential of rain if going door-to-door.
2. Contact some local businesses and see if you can set up a pop-up booth on their Customer Appreciation Day, or other busy days.
3. Do a major city blitz with each unit taking a different neighbourhood, or for smaller towns a different street and cover the most ground.
4. Encourage Pathfinders and Rangers to be buddies with younger girls and newbies and show them the ropes of a great sales pitch.
5. Rehearse a great sales pitch at your meetings before cookies even arrive in their hands! LOL

6. Post a Group Sales on Social Media promoting your event. Although we ask families to keep it off Garage sale pages, a blitz for the city is the best way to plug a big event to the most audience!
7. Have a cookie song on hand to sing to the customers if you find your Sparks or Brownies getting bored. Oh, who am I kidding, the Guides/Pathfinders/Rangers can also get in on that lively action.
8. Attend January Conference in Regina, (January 2020), and come to see my resources and maybe learn how to build a Cookie Booth of your very own!
9. Know what you are selling when customers ask. Our cookies are Peanut free, however. they are not Dairy or Gluten free, not Vegan and not Sugar free.
10. Attend a major sporting event in your local area and watch them fly off the table. (Make sure you have enough supervision for the young girls giving change.)

Bonus: Have you mentioned to people travelling to Regina or Saskatoon that they can also pick up cookies year round at the Guide Offices? A case of 12 is only \$60! Plus, they freeze great!

Well, I will wait for the pictures to come flooding in! Good Luck everyone with our most successful sales year yet! Stay Safe and Have Fun!
