SASKATCHEWAN ADVENTURE CAMPING

You must be a current **Pathfinder / Ranger / Trex / Extra Ops / Girl Assistant** member to apply. Not every youth that applies will be accepted. A selection process will be used for these camps.

To ensure the greatest opportunity for all, each youth will only be accepted to one adventure. You may apply for both or just one, it is up to you. Only one application form is needed, and you will be able to indicate your preference on the form if applicable.

Further information about gear, kit lists, and trip details will come once the group has been chosen, and the trips have been finalized. We reserve the right to change any details about the trips given here for any reason which may include safety.

Application deadline is March 30, 2020 at 11:59pm SK time

Acceptance will be announced by April 20, 2020

Camp fee: \$100, only payable upon acceptance and due by May 15, 2020

The camp fee is subsidized by a Sask. Parks and Recreation Association grant; however if you require further assistance, please identify your need in your application.

Backpacking Adventure

Dates: July 14 - 18, 2020

Youth – maximum 8 participants

Gather in Waskesiu to meet your new friends and get ready for your adventure. Spend 4 days backpacking the famed Grey Owl's Trail in Prince Albert National Park. This is an out and back trail

for a total of 40 km. You will carry all your gear including personal items like a sleeping bag and a share of the group items such as the tent and food.

Prerequisites – You are a current Pathfinder / Ranger / Trex / Extra Ops / or Girl Assistant member. You are physically fit and able to carry a 25-30 lb backpack for several hours a day for 4 days. Free from ankle, knee, or hip issues that may hinder safe and comfortable travel over uneven ground. You will need to provide your own hiking boots and personal gear. Backpacks and other gear such as sleeping bags can be rented through Girl Guides if required.

Canoe Adventure

Dates: July 22 - 26, 2020

Youth – maximum 12 participants

First you will learn to canoe while earning a Paddle Canada certificate on a lake near Saskatoon. After some basics you will head down the South Saskatchewan River and go on a 4 day paddling adventure from Saskatoon to Batoche learning about this area of history as you go.

Prerequisites – You are a current Pathfinder / Ranger / Trex / Extra Ops / or Girl Assistant member. You do not need to know how to canoe, we will teach you, but you are physically fit and able to paddle for several hours a day for 4 days. Free from shoulder, elbow, or wrist issues that may hinder safe and comfortable travel. You must be able to pass the GG boating test that includes swimming 25 meters while wearing a PFD, and demonstrating the HELP position for 1 minute. You will need to provide your own personal gear. Canoes, dry bags, and safety gear including PFDs are provided.


Those planning to attend the Provincial Guiding AGM in Watrous on May 2 may still do so and will be asked to contact the Provincial Office once the invitation has gone out.



You may also consider registering your clean-up with <u>The Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup</u>. After the event, when you submit numbers of trash items collected and people who attended, they'll send you a free crest! (Delivery timelines vary). And hot off the presses – the Piping Plover will be featured on this year's crest!

To register your community group for PITCH-IN Week, please go to www.pitch-in.ca. Community groups can vary in size from having a family clean up to having an entire school help beautify the

environment. To further support the campaign, consider ordering a 2020 PITCH-IN Week crest or flying a PITCH-IN Week flag in your community. Lastly, get a certificate of participation for every volunteer at www.pitch-in.ca to commemorate the event and keep the tradition alive.
