About Girl Guides of Canada- Guides du Canada

Since it started in 1910, Girl Guides of Canada—Guides du Canada has impacted the lives of countless girls and women. As Canada’s largest female organization, Guiding has contributed to the success of its Members by providing positive role models for girls. The program provides opportunities for fun, friendship, adventures, personal and leadership development and community involvement.

Today there are nearly 90,000 Guiding Members—almost 71,000 girl Members and over 19,000 adult Members.

Guiding remains true to its ideals as a dynamic organization, changing with the times to reflect the needs and interests of today’s girls and women.

Guiding is fun, bold and energetic. It empowers participants to face challenges with confidence. Through Guiding’s various imaginative and innovative activity choices, girls are encouraged to fulfill their potential. It helps them become independent, confident and caring individuals as they develop decision-making and life skills. Guiding helps them connect with their community and the world.



Organization

Girls belong to a Unit. A group of Units form a district; groups of districts form an area. There are 10 Guiding areas in British Columbia. Guiding is 145 countries strong around the world!

The Guiding program is a place to have fun, learn life skills and make friends. The program is taught through games, crafts, songs, challenges, camping and international Guiding. Interest badges are optional and often completed at home. We encourage each Member to have a program or activity book for her branch.

All Unit leaders are volunteers—we call them “Guiders.” It is important to select the right women to guide our girls. The screening process includes:

- interviews
- references
- Police Records Check
- a code of conduct



Volunteers are provided with ongoing training and resources.

Getting Involved

Your support and input is vital to our organization and we encourage you to participate. These shared experiences will give you and your family fond memories.

Your valuable support allows Guiders to run a fun-filled program and engage in activities that may not otherwise be possible. If you are interested in becoming a Guider yourself, or in volunteering in another way, please let your Unit Guider know.

Financial Commitments

Guiding is available to all girls and women. Financial assistance is available if required. Please contact your Unit Guider or District Commissioner for more information.

Membership/ registration fee

The membership/registration fee will be set each year and will be shared with the local District and Unit.

Uniform

Guiding is a uniformed organization. There are uniforms and other merchandise options available from the online store.

It is recommended that each girl have her own shirt and badge scarf.

Dues

Dues help offset the cost of running the program, and vary from Unit to Unit.

Cookies

Fall: chocolatey mint cookie sales

Spring: classic cookie sales
All girls are expected to participate in sales.

Camp

Camp fees are determined by Unit Guiders after considering the cost of food, accommodation, crafts, special activities and supplies. Units may camp once or several times throughout the year, depending on the age and interest of the girls.



The Branches of Guiding

Sparks

Age: 5–6

Sparks have fun with girls their own age. Sparks is where the Guiding adventure begins.

Promise: I Promise to share and be a friend

Brownies

Age: 7–8

Brownies explore their community and the world around them through an activity-based program that includes camping, science and the arts.

Guides / Pathfinders / Rangers/ Adults

Age: 9–12 (Guides), 13–15 (Pathfinders), 15–18 (Rangers), 19+ (Adults)

In Guides, Pathfinders and Rangers, girls continue to develop their skills and self-confidence through a varied and challenging program.

Girl Guides and Cookies: A Winning Combination!

Cookies sales provide our main source of funds and benefit Girl Guides at all levels. Profits are shared with the Unit, district, area and provincial councils to support Guiding programs.

Revenue from cookie sales may be used by Units to purchase supplies, badges or craft materials or to subsidize camps, special events or other Unit activities.

At other levels, cookie revenue is used to develop and implement program resources and to coordinate special events, international and inter–provincial trips for girls, training and leadership development.



Fun and Learning

The Girl Guide cookie sales program is intended to be FUN! There are many benefits for the girls other than simply raising funds. These benefits sometimes go unrecognized, but they should not be overlooked.

Participation in a cookie campaign helps to build self-esteem by developing, modeling and teaching:
