

Guides - Lady Baden Powell Award

The following resource will help you transition from the current Lady Baden-Powell award requirements to the updated requirements.

- Girls entering their last year of Guides can continue to earn the award using the existing requirements.
- Girls entering their second year of Guides can use existing requirements, new requirements, or combination of the two; and use the new requirements for year three.
- It's recommended that any girl just starting on work to earn the award use the new award requirements

Remember, no work should ever be lost, so use your best judgement to determine what work has been completed and assess what still needs to be done.

In her last message before her death, Lady Baden-Powell wrote:

"I trust you will continue fully to use the system of work and play that our Movement provides, keeping up the fun and friendships made at your meetings and camps, abiding by the Promise and upholding the Laws that you undertook to live by when you joined up. In that way you will not only advance yourself in body, mind and spirit, but you will affect those around you, in doing what is honourable and right and wise, and in giving out kindness of thought and action, thus striving against all ills and helping to make the world a happier and better place in which to live."

Reflect on what Lady Baden-Powell's words mean to you. How do they make you feel? What do they make you think about? What do they inspire you to do? What can you do using your Guiding experiences to make some of your hopes for yourself, your friends and family, your community or the world become true? Find a creative way to express these thoughts - perhaps in song, or a story, maybe in a collage or skit. You might even do a STEAM-based project (science, technology, engineering, engineering, arts, math) or offer service or volunteer as a way to express what these words mean to you. Share what you've created or done with others, including your unit, as well as girls in other branches. .

Part C	Complete a project to help girls in your unit enjoy their Guiding experience. This should involve a commitment over time.
Part D	Participate in a major community service project.
Part E	Participate in three Pathfinder meetings.
Part F	Take Part in a community service activity that involves doing something for someone else.
Part G	Share your favourite Guiding experiences with a group of friends not in Guiding.

Part **New Award Requirements**

Part C	Take a leadership role in the delivery of a unit meeting, event, outing or special project (including a camp) for your own unit or a younger branch. You should be involved in all aspects of this from planning through delivery of the meeting/event/project and its evaluation.
Part B	Participate in a major community service project. This cannot be the same service project as used to complete the Your Action Theme of the Take Action Program Area.
Part E	Participate in at least three Pathfinders meetings.

Part D	Share your favourite experiences and memories of Guides with your unit, a younger branch or a group of friends from outside Guiding. Include what younger girls have to look forward to when they become a Guide, or what you are looking forward to as a Pathfinder.
