The following resource will help you transition from the current Community Service Award requirements to the new requirements.

- Girls entering their last year of Pathfinders can continue to earn the award using the existing requirements.
- Girls entering their second year of Pathfinders can use existing requirements, new requirements, or combination of the two; and the new requirements for year three.
- Any girls who are just starting on work to earn the certificate can use the new program requirements.

Remember, no work should ever be lost, so use your best judgement to determine what work has been completed and assess what still needs to be done.

- Camping, Here We Come!

Two activities from the Citizenship Certificate could be counted towards the 15 hours of the Community Service award.

## Part 2

#### Learn and demonstrate leadership.

Plan and participate in three outdoor camps, sleep in tent/shelter, have at least five meals and stay at least one night.

- 1st camp: as a participant, helping in the planning and at camp
- 2nd camp: as an assistant to the leader, with responsibility for a specific aspect of the program
- 3rd camp: as a leader of a team. Only one girl in the group may use this camp for her Canada Cord.

#### OR

Plan and participate in three leadership events that together take a total of approx. 25 hours. Two should take approx. 5 hours/ea. and one approx. 15 hours.

- 1st event: as a participant, helping in the planning and at the event
- 2nd event: as an assistant to the leader with responsibility for a specific aspect of the event
- 3rd event: as a leader of a team. Only one girl on the team may use the event for her Canada Cord.

#### Learn and demonstrate leadership.

Plan and participate in three outdoor camps, sleep in tent/shelter, have at least five meals and stay at least one night.

- 1st camp: as a participant, helping in the planning and at camp
- 2nd camp: as an assistant to the leader, with responsibility for a specific aspect of the program
- 3rd camp: as a leader of a team. Can be completed alone or by two girls working together.

#### OR

Plan and participate in three leadership events that together take a total of approx. 25 hours. Two should take approx. 5 hours each and one approx. 15 hours.

- 3rd event: as a leader of a team. Can be completed alone or by two girls working together.

## Part 4

- 1) Participate in two activities with Rangers members.
  Alternatively, plan how you could set up a Rangers unit.
- 2) Prepare and lead each of the following for younger girls:
- Outdoor games and/or activities
- Games and/or activities about Guiding values and/or international Guiding
- Programming based on a theme
- 3) Bridging activities are in addition to the Community Service award and camping or leadership event options.
- 4) The activities where you are leading younger girls could be done over a minimum of:
- Four unit meetings, or
- Two half-days of a special-event program, or
- One day at a camp.

Participate in bridging activities with Rangers and younger girls.

- Participate in two activities with Rangers members. If there is not currently a Ranger unit in your area, make a plan for how you can start a Ranger unit.
- 2) Take a leadership role in the delivery of at least one unit meeting for younger girls or three activities at camp. You should be involved in all aspects of these activities from planning, through delivery of the activities and their evaluation.
- 3) Bridging activities are in addition to the Community Service award and camping or leadership event options.
- 4) The activities where you are leading younger girls could be done over a minimum of:
- Four unit meetings, or
- Two half-days of a special-event program, or
- One day at a camp.
